HOUSE AMENDMENT "BB" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1420, L.D. 1919, Bill, "An Act To Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government and To Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2004 and June 30, 2005"

Amend the amendment in Part V in section 29 by inserting after the 2nd sentence the following new sentence: 'The first payment to private nonmedical institutions authorized under section 28 of this Part is first due on August 1, 2004.'
