SENATE AMENDMENT "I" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1420, L.D. 1919, Bill, "An Act To Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government and To Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2004 and June 30, 2005"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of Part S and inserting in its place the following:

**PART S**

**Sec. S-1. Transfer of responsibilities of State Nuclear Safety Advisor.** Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, section 52, the Public Utilities Commission shall assume the responsibilities of the State Nuclear Safety Advisor as set forth in Title 25, section 52, subsection 2.

**Sec. S-2. Transfer of responsibilities of State Nuclear Safety Inspector.** Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 663, the Public Utilities Commission shall assume the responsibilities of the State Nuclear Safety Inspector as set forth in Title 22, section 663, subsection 2.

**Sec. S-3. Legislation for transfer of responsibilities.** Not later than January 15, 2005, the Chairman of the Public Utilities Commission shall submit a bill to the First Regular Session of the 122nd Legislature to accomplish the purposes set forth in sections 1 and 2 of this Part.

**Sec. S-4. Rules in effect.** All rules regarding the State Nuclear Safety Advisor and the State Nuclear Safety Inspector in effect on the effective date of this Part remain in effect until

changed by the Public Utilities Commission pursuant to the Maine  
Administrative Procedure Act.

**Sec. S-5. Transfer of funds for State Nuclear Safety Inspector.**  
Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State  
Controller shall transfer \$180,000 on or before June 30th of each  
year from the Other Special Revenue funds received to support the  
cost of the State Nuclear Safety Inspector pursuant to the Maine  
Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 664, subsection 5 to the  
unappropriated surplus of the General Fund.

**Sec. S-6. Transfer of funds for State Nuclear Safety Advisor.**  
Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State  
Controller shall transfer on or before June 30th of each year  
from the Other Special Revenue funds received by the State  
Planning Office pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25,  
section 52, subsection 3 to the Public Utilities Commission to  
support nuclear safety activities conducted by the Public  
Utilities Commission.

**Sec. S-7. Appropriations and allocations.** The following  
appropriations and allocations are made.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment strikes Part S of Committee Amendment "A" and instead transfers the duties of the State Nuclear Safety Inspector and the State Nuclear Safety Advisor to the Public Utilities Commission. This amendment also transfers the revenue from the State Nuclear Safety Inspector fee imposed on nuclear facility licensees to the General Fund and the revenue from the monitoring fee imposed on nuclear power plant licensees to the Public Utilities Commission to support nuclear safety activities.

This amendment also provides additional funding for peer support services.
