2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2390, sub-§1, ¶K** is enacted to read:

6 K. The load on a combination vehicle with a 48-foot trailer
8 transporting rough-sawn, milled or finished lumber
10 exclusively may extend rearward beyond the body of the
12 vehicle by no more than 18 inches, as long as the entire
14 length of the trailer is filled with the lumber.

12 SUMMARY

14 This bill allows the transport of rough-sawn, milled or
16 finished lumber with an overhang of 18 inches or less on a
48-foot trailer.
