Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

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SUMMARY

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	This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. It broadens
4	the application of the bill to emergency medications rather than only asthma inhalers and epinephrine pens. The amendment deletes
6	the provision of the bill that would require camps to allow children to possess certain emergency medications and replaces it
8	with a requirement that the emergency medication be readily available to the camper. The amendment also adds an emergency
10	preamble and clause to the bill so that it takes effect upon approval. The amendment repeals and reenacts the authority of
12	the Department of Health and Human Services to adopt routine
