Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

SUMMARY

This bill prohibits the United States from owning or acquiring land in this State unless the ownership of the land is expressly authorized by the United States Constitution. It also directs the Department of Administrative and Financial Services and the Department of Conservation to recommend to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over property matters a procedure for transferring to the State all land that is owned by the United States and that is not authorized by the United States Constitution. The bill also repeals sections of law that authorize the United States to acquire land in the State for national forests.
