Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1760. sub-§88 is enacted to read:

88. Books, clothing and school supplies during 3rd week of
August. Sales during the 3rd full calendar week in August of:

 A. The following items having a taxable value of \$50 or less: books, clothing, wallets or bags, including handbags,
backpacks, fanny packs and diaper bags, but excluding briefcases, suitcases and other garment bags; and

B. School supplies having a taxable value of \$10 or less.14For purposes of this paragraph, "school supplies" means
pens, pencils, erasers, crayons, notebooks, notebook paper,16legal pads, composition books, poster paper, scissors,
cellophane tape, glue or paste, rulers, computer disks,18protractors, compasses and calculators.

20 Sec. 2. Rules. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue Services shall adopt routine 22 technical rules pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5. chapter 375, subchapter 2-A to carry out the provisions of this 24 Act.

SUMMARY

This bill, modeled on Florida law, enacts a sales tax 30 exemption during the 3rd week of August for sales of books and clothing valued at \$50 or less and school supplies valued at \$10 32 or less.
