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The Board of Directors of Dirigo Health shall submit a 12 report that includes findings and recommendations from the analyses of issues identified in this section as part of the 14 annual report required by November 3, 2006 in accordance with 15 Title 24-A, section 6908, subsection 6.

Sec. 4. Comprehensive employee health program addressing obesity. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Human Resources, Division of Employee Health and Benefits shall implement a comprehensive, population-based approach to addressing obesity-related risk factors and disease management, including nutrition counseling and physical activity and health risk identification and management. Implementation should include:

 Offering to negotiate flex-time options in collective bargaining for all state employees to encourage and support
 employee health;

30 2. Conducting an inventory of the availability of fitness centers in locations of heavy concentrations of state employees;

3. Creating performance management objectives through which 34 supervisors and managers support and encourage healthy lifestyles among employees they supervise; and

Dedicating at least 0.5% of annual health insurance
 premiums for all state employees to support employee health and wellness.'

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 6 and 42 inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 6. Healthy food and beverage options at state cafeterias, snack bars and vending machines. The Department of Labor, Bureau of
 Rehabilitation Services, Division of the Blind and Visually Impaired shall:

1. Implement recommendations of food choice committees to 50 include healthy food and beverage options at cafeterias, snack

bars and vending machines under the division's purview. These
food choice committees shall consider providing price incentives
for purchase of healthy foods and beverages;

 Include in the food choice committee for any executive
 department that uses a cafeteria or snack bar under the division's purview a wellness coordinator from that department;

10 3. Analyze the costs associated with:

A. Developing a system for tracking food purchases at cafeterias and snack bars and in vending machines under the division's purview; and

B. Performing nutritional analysis on all major-selling food items and posting caloric and nutritional information
 at cafeterias and snack bars under the division's purview.

20 The Department of Labor, Bureau of Rehabilitation Services, Division of the Blind and Visually Impaired shall report back to 22 the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services by December 1, 2005.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

28 'Sec. 9. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

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SUMMARY

46 This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It strikes from the bill the Maine Obesity Prevention Fund. It adds a prohibition on expenditures in the absence of obtaining outside funding for the Commission to Study Public Health. It strikes 50 reference to information gathered from the food stamp program

with regard to consumer buying habits. It strikes a provision
that would have added at least one position to develop a health improvement infrastructure. The amendment removes the
requirement of tracking purchases and analyzing nutritional content of foods sold through the Department of Labor, Bureau of
Rehabilitation Services, Division of the Blind and Visually Impaired.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill's requirement that 0.5% of annual health insurance premiums for state employees be dedicated to support employee health and wellness programs would result in additional costs to the state employee health program. While some of the current expenses of the state employee health program may be "countable" toward this requirement, it is assumed meeting this requirement as well as existing program obligations could not be accomplished within existing resources and would require a rate increase to keep the state employee health program adequately funded. Such a rate increase would result in additional costs to the General Fund, Highway Fund, and all other funds with allocated costs of the state employee health program .

General Fund appropriations of \$63,780 for 2005-06 and \$261,321 for 2006-07 and Highway Fund allocations of \$27,033 for 2005-06 and \$114,514 for 2006-07 are included in the bill for the salary plan reserve accounts to fund the increases for General Fund and Highway Fund active employee health insurance costs. The costs for employees paid by other funds, including a small amount for the Fund for a Healthy Maine, may require increased allotments as recommended by the State Budget Officer and approved by the Governor. It is further assumed this requirement would apply to the contract year beginning April 1, 2006.

Any additional costs to the Dirigo Health program in implementing Section 3 of the bill can be absorbed by the Dirigo Health program utilizing existing budgetary resources.

Additional costs to the Department of Labor, Division of Blind and Visually Impaired can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.

Legislative Study

Extending the Commission to Study Public Health will require the Commission to seek funds from other sources to fully fund all costs of the commission. Consistent with provisions of Resolve 2003, Chapter 95, before meetings are authorized and expenses can be incurred or reimbursed, sufficient outside funding must be received. All contributions are subject to approval of the Legislative Council.

An allocation of Other Special Revenue funds in the amount of \$6,530 in fiscal year 2005-06 and \$7,280 in fiscal year 2006-07 is needed to fund all costs of the commission from this dedicated account should outside sources of funding be received. If sufficient funds are not received, no meeting can be held or costs incurred.

The Commission to Study Public Health received contributions in the amount of \$7,280 as a result of Resolve 2003, chapter 95. Expenditures for the previous work of the commission were \$4,220.31. There currently is an unexpended balance of \$3,059.69 which would be available to fund a portion of the costs of the commission, if the commission is extended.
