SUMMARY

This amendment allows the home address of a Maine State Retirement System retiree, until September 15, 2007, to be 12 disclosed to nonprofit or public retiree organizations for recruitment purposes unless the retiree "opts out" from 14 authorizing this disclosure on a form provided by the retirement system. Beginning September 15, 2007, the information again 16 becomes confidential unless the retiree "opts in" by signing a 18 waiver of confidentiality. The amendment also requires the retirement system to deny information in the future to an 20 organization that obtained information for the purpose of membership recruitment but used the information for another 22 purpose.
