An Act To Amend the Laws Regulating the Practice of Optometry

2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §2414 is enacted to read:
<b>4</b> 6	§2414. Contract with optical shop or other commercial or mercantile establishment
8	1. Contract requirements. An optometrist may enter into a written contract for space in or on the premises of an optical shop or other commercial or mercantile establishment if:
.2	A. The optical shop or other commercial or mercantile establishment does not control or attempt to control the professional judgment of the optometrist;
6 8	B. The optometrist maintains control of the optometrist's practice and the optometrist's records related to the practice;
0	C. The office or offices to be used for the practice of optometry are private and equipped as required for a complete ocular examination; and
<b>4</b> 6	D. Appropriate identification is visible to the public indicating the optometrist's name and phone number and that the optometrist is independent of the optical shop or other commercial or mercantile establishment.
8 0 2	2. Effect of rental or payment. Rental or payment for space, equipment or services on a flat rate or percentage of gross revenue is lawful and may not be construed as fee splitting or the sharing or dividing of profit.

2	Sec. 4. 32 MRSA §2435, as amended by PL 1993, c. 600, Pt. A, §162, is further amended by adding a new 2nd paragraph to read:
4	This chapter does not prohibit a written contract for space, equipment or other services between any person, firm or
6	corporation and an optometrist as authorized in section 2414.
8	Such a contract may not be construed as the direct or indirect practice of optometry.
