2	Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1661, sub-§1, ¶¶D and E, as repealed and
4	replaced by PL 2001, c. 656, §1, are amended to read:
б	D. An electric relay or other electrical device; and
8	E. A lamp+;_and
10	Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §1661, sub-§1, ¶F is enacted to read:
12	F. A novelty that contains a battery that contains mercury.
14	Sec. 3. 38 MRSA §1661, sub-§6 is enacted to read:
16	6. Novelty. "Novelty" means a product intended mainly for enjoyment by or adornment of children. "Novelty" includes, but
18	is not limited to, items intended for use by children as practical jokes, figurines, adornments, toys, games, cards,
20	ornaments, jewelry and items of apparel.
22	Sec. 4. 38 MRSA §1661-C, sub-§5-A is enacted to read:
24	5-A. Novelties. After January 1, 2007, a person may not sell or offer to sell or distribute for promotional purposes in
26	the State a novelty that contains a battery that contains mercury.

30	This bill bans, after January 1, 2007, the sale in this
32	State of children's novelties that contain mercury batteries, such as light-up games, cards and adornments.
