The bill allows 44 only state, county and municipal employees and contractors of 46 those governments to perform the services of an arborist without having licenses during emergencies that result in public hardships but requires those contractors to be licensed all other 48times. The bill limits the requirement of the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to investigate all 50 complaints made to it to only those complaints that are formally 52 made.
