22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the
24	following:
26	'Sec.1. 12 MRSA §8005 is enacted to read:
28	<u>§8005. Certain information confidential</u>
30	1. Contact information. Social security numbers, addresses,
32	telephone numbers and electronic mail addresses of landowners owning less than 1,000 acres of forest land statewide and
34	collected by the bureau for the purposes of contacting landowners under section 8611, or received by the bureau in notifications filed under section 8883-B, or in reports received under Title
36	36, section 581-G are confidential and may be disclosed only in accordance with this section.
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	2. Forest management plan and information. Social security
40	numbers, forest management plans and supporting documentation of forest management activities on private forest land and held by
42	the bureau for the purposes of administering landowner assistance
	programs authorized under this chapter and chapter 805 are
44	confidential and may be disclosed only in accordance with this section.
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3. Disclosure. Except as provided in subsection 4, the
director may disclose confidential information in accordance with
this subsection. Confidential information disclosed pursuant to
this subsection remains the property of the bureau. Recipients of
the confidential information may not disclose this information or
use this information except as authorized by the director.

- 8 A. The director may disclose information designated as confidential under this section to a governmental entity 10 that, in the opinion of the director, requires this information.
- B.The director shall provide names, addresses and14electronic mail addresses upon request to a nonprofit
corporation that provides educational services to forest16landowners regarding sound forest management as long as the
information disclosed is used to provide information about18forest management.

 4. Information designated as confidential by state or federal agency. The director may not disclose information
furnished to the director that has been designated as confidential by a state or federal agency furnishing the information unless disclosure is authorized by the furnishing agency.

- 5. Penalty. A person who receives confidential information pursuant to subsection 3, paragraph B and uses that information for a purpose other than that authorized by the director commits a civil violation punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.

a forest management information clearinghouse service with a statewide toll-free number. The information and referral service

- D. Insect and disease management practices;
 - E. Recreation management options; and

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F. Wildlife management options.

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 2. Forms. The Department of Conservation, Bureau of
2 Forestry shall annually provide municipalities with forms for submitting the information required under subsection 1. To the
4 extent that the bureau has the required information, the bureau shall include that information on the forms.

3. Confidentiality. Addresses, telephone numbers and
8 electronic mail addresses of forest landowners owning less than
1,000 acres statewide contained in reports filed under this
10 section are confidential when in possession of the Department of
Conservation, Bureau of Forestry and may be disclosed only in
12 accordance with Title 12, section 8005.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It clarifies confidentiality provisions for information held by the Department 18 of Conservation, Bureau of Forestry. It requires the Director of 20 the Bureau of Forestry to keep addresses and electronic mail addresses confidential for landowners owning less than 1,000 acres of forest land statewide but requires this information to 22 be provided upon request to a nonprofit organization that provides educational services to forest landowners regarding 24 sound forest management for the purpose of distributing information on forest management. 26
