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

The department shall adopt rules to implement this section, including rules on collecting information 12 and data, selecting members of the panel, collecting and using individually identifiable health information and conducting reviews under this section. The rules must ensure that access to 14 individually identifiable health information is restricted as much as possible while enabling the panel to accomplish its work. The rules must establish a protocol to preserve 18 confidentiality, specify the manner in which family and authorized representatives will be contacted for permission and maintain public confidence in the protection of individually 20 Rules adopted pursuant to this identifiable information. 22 subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
