Presented by Representative CUMMINGS of Portland. Cosponsored by Senator WESTON of Waldo and Representative: BURNS of Berwick. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, Maine's system of learning results has established high standards for student achievement and high school graduation; and

Whereas, Maine Education Assessment and other performance data demonstrate that there is a significant gap between student achievement and state standards, jeopardizing the ability of thousands of Maine students to earn a high school diploma by the 2008 deadline established by the Legislature; and

Whereas, all Maine school districts are expected to meet the same learning standards and to do so according to state requirements; and

Whereas, efficient implementation of the system of learning 20 results requires widespread changes in traditional school organization and educational practices; and

Whereas, moving to a standards-based public education system 24 requires support services not currently widely available to school districts; and

Whereas, Maine already has a variety of nongovernment organizations that have developed efficient approaches to service delivery but lack the resources to provide large-scale support to Maine schools; and

Whereas, successful and efficient implementation of the system of learning results requires that there be rapid collaborative development of high-quality products, policies and procedures that support state requirements and widespread dissemination of these policies and procedures to avoid unnecessary duplication of effort, including training in their use; and

40 Whereas, successful and efficient implementation of the system of learning results requires support services that: locally, regionally and statewide; 42 operate are based on individual district needs but consistent with state requirements; 44 are flexible and responsive and designed to address local needs when and where needed; allow people to learn with and from each other in a safe, professional environment; build the capacity of 46 local districts to act on achievement data to improve student 48 learning; and create and disseminate products that can be used by educators throughout the State, such as teacher-developed lessons and organizational strategies for successful implementation; and 50

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of

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## §6206. Educational costs

Costs relating to the development of the state assessment 4 program, printing, distribution, analysis and dissemination of results for each school administrative unit shall must be paid by 6 the department.

 8 Costs associated with the implementation support and service of the learning results under section 6202, subsection 3 qualify
10 for funds from the Fund for the Efficient Delivery of Educational Services under section 15684.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the 14 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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## SUMMARY

This bill provides financial support to existing 20 nongovernment education organizations that create and manage statewide and regional networks that provide Maine learning 22 results implementation support and services to Maine educators and school systems.
