An Act To Require the Owner of a Service Dog To Show a Certificate of Completion of a Basic Obedience Class from a Service Dog Trainer in Order for That Dog To Be Admitted to a Retail Establishment or Restaurant

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §3966, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 625, §94, is amended to read:

#### 6 §3966. Animals in food stores

8 It is unlawful for any person, other than the owner or manager, to bring any animal into a store where food is sold for
10 human consumption or into a restaurant where food is prepared and served on the premises. This section shall does not apply to any
12 person requiring the services of a seeing-eye-deg service dog if the owner of the service dog shows the store or restaurant a
14 certificate of completion for the dog from a service dog trainer. For purposes of this section, "service dog" has the
16 same meaning as in Title 7, section 3961-A.

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### SUMMARY

This bill allows an owner of a service dog to bring the dog 22 into food stores and restaurants if the owner shows the store or restaurant a certificate of completion for the dog from a basic 24 obedience class administered by a service dog trainer.
