## An Act To Establish Working Hours and Wages for Teenagers

### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §664, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

<u>5. Minors under 17 years of age.</u> Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 1,
the minimum wage for a minor under 17 years of age is \$5.25 per hour.

5 Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §774, sub-§1, ¶B, as amended by PL 2003, c. 53, §1, is further 6 amended to read:

7 B. More than  $\frac{20}{20}$  hours in any week when the minor's school is in session, except 8 that the minor may work up to 8 hours on each day that an authorized school closure 9 occurs in that minor's school up to a total of 28 hours in that week. In addition, the 10 maximum weekly hours a minor may work is 50 hours during any week that the 11 approved school calendar for the minor's school is less than 3 days or during the first or last week of the school calendar, regardless of how many days the minor's school 12 is in session for the week. If requested, a school must provide verification of its 13 closings to the minor's employer or the Department of Labor; 14

15 Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §774, sub-§2, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 544, §5, is
amended to read:

B. More than 18 22 hours in any week when school is in session;

#### SUMMARY

This bill sets the minimum wage for a minor under 17 years of age at \$5.25 per hour, increases from 20 to 30 the hours a minor under 18 years of age may work during a week while school is in session and increases from 18 to 22 the hours a minor under 16 years of age may work during a week while school is in session.
