#### An Act To Amend the Laws Concerning Public Fighting

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §501, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1989, c. 266, is further amended to read:
- 4 1. In a public place, he the person intentionally or recklessly causes annoyance to others by intentionally:
- 6 A. Making loud and unreasonable noises; or

- B. Activating a device, or exposing a substance, which that releases noxious and offensive odors; or
- 9 C. Engaging in fighting, without being licensed or privileged to do so;
- 10 Sec. 2. 17-A MRSA §501, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:
- 11 1-A. In a public place, the person intentionally or recklessly engages in fighting without being licensed or privileged to do so;

13 SUMMARY

- Under current law, a person who engages in public fighting is guilty of disorderly conduct if such behavior causes annoyance to others. This bill removes the requirement
- that such behavior must cause annoyance to others and provides instead that a person is
- guilty of disorderly conduct if, in a public place, that person engages in fighting without
- being licensed or privileged to do so.
