An Act To Establish a Special License Plate To Honor Maine Residents Serving Our Country

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3 Whereas, Maine residents serving in conflicts throughout the world need our 4 support; and

5 Whereas, the need to support our troops and assist their families is urgent and 6 important; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
therefore,

- 11 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

18 §456-D. We Support Our Troops registration plates

Beginning November 1, 2007, the Secretary of State shall issue registration plates, referred to in this section as "We Support Our Troops plates," to support Maine troops and their families in accordance with this section and section 468 except that, for the purposes of this section, the requirement for the list of 2,000 names of supporters as required by section 468, subsection 2 is waived. We Support Our Troops plates are not required for registration of a motor vehicle but are to allow citizens to participate in voluntarily funding special programs to assist the Maine families of troops.

 1. We Support Our Troops plates. The Secretary of State, upon receiving an application and evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Title 36, section 1482, the registration fee required by section 501 and the administrative fee and contribution provided for in subsection 2, shall issue a registration certificate and a set of We Support Our Troops plates to be used in lieu of regular registration plates. These plates must bear identification numbers and letters.

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32 2. Administrative fee and contribution to special programs. A person may 33 contribute funds to the Secretary of State for the purposes of providing financial 34 assistance to members of the Maine National Guard and their families or residents of the 35 State who are members of the Reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States and 36 their families for emergencies and other special needs by applying for the We Support

- 1 <u>Our Troops plates and submitting, in addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee</u> 2 required under section 501, a sum of \$20 credited as follows:
- 3 A. Ten dollars to the Secretary of State for use in accordance with subsection 5; and
- B. Ten dollars to the Specialty License Plate Fund established in section 469 for
 administrative and production costs.
- 6 **3. Renewal fee.** In addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee required 7 under section 501, the annual renewal contribution for We Support Our Troops plates is 8 \$15, which must be deposited with the Treasurer of State and credited as follows:
- 9 A. Ten dollars to the Secretary of State for use in accordance with subsection 5; and
- 10 <u>B. Five dollars to the Specialty License Plate Fund established in section 469 for</u> 11 <u>administrative and production costs.</u>
- 4. Design. A sponsor must submit a design for the We Support Our Troops plates to
 the Secretary of State for approval or modification in accordance with section 468,
 subsection 5. The design must include the shape of the boundaries of the State of Maine,
 with an image of a curled ribbon superimposed over the shape of the State, with the
 words "We Support Our Troops" at the bottom of the plate.
- 17 5. Administration of fees. The Secretary of State monthly shall deposit all funds collected under subsection 2, paragraph A and subsection 3, paragraph A in the Maine 18 19 National Guard Foundation Fund Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of 20 Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management and referred to in this subsection as "the 21 fund." Revenue in the fund must be used to provide financial assistance to members of 22 the Maine National Guard, residents of the State who are members of the Reserves of the 23 Armed Forces of the United States and the families of those members of the Maine 24 National Guard or Reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States for emergencies 25 and other special needs as determined by the We Support Our Troops Advisory Board 26 established in Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 84-A.
- 6. We Support Our Troops Advisory Board. The We Support Our Troops
 Advisory Board, as established by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 84-A, consists of 9
 members. Membership of the advisory board is as follows:
- 30 <u>A. Six members appointed by the Governor, in consultation with the Adjutant</u>
 31 <u>General of the State of Maine, as follows:</u>
- 32 (1) Two persons, each representing the interests of the Maine National Guard;
- 33 (2) Two persons, each representing the interests of Maine residents in the
 34 Reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States; and
- 35 (3) Two persons representing the interests of the public;
- 36 B. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 37 C. One member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the
 38 House; and
- 39 D. The Adjutant General of the State of Maine.

1 The board shall determine the use of the revenue in the Maine National Guard Foundation 2 Fund Special Revenue Funds account in the Department of Defense, Veterans and 3 Emergency Management. Revenue in the fund must be used to provide financial 4 assistance in the form of loans or grants to members of the Maine National Guard, 5 residents of the State who are members of the Reserves of the Armed Forces of the 6 United States and the families of those members of the Maine National Guard or 7 Reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States for emergencies and other special 8 needs.

9 The board shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having 10 jurisdiction over transportation matters by June 30th of each year. The report must 11 provide a detailed account of funds for each fiscal year and include the number of loans 12 and grants awarded, the names of those who received loans and grant money, a 13 description of the process for awarding loans and grants and the total amount of loan and 14 grant money awarded.

15 Sec. 3. Protection of design of plates. The Secretary of State shall copyright the 16 design of the registration plate established pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17 29-A, section 456-D and make the design available for a fee to other states interested in 18 establishing this specialty license plate.

19 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this 20 legislation takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

22 This bill authorizes the issuance of a special registration plate to raise funds for 23 members of the Maine National Guard and their families and residents of the State who 24 are members of the Reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States and their families. 25 The bill establishes the We Support Our Troops Advisory Board and directs the board to 26 determine the appropriate use of the revenue generated by the special registration plate 27 and distribute the funds in the form of loans or grants to members of the Maine National 28 Guard and their families and residents of the State who are members of the Reserves of 29 the Armed Forces of the United States and their families.

The bill also directs the Secretary of State to copyright the design of this plate and offer the design to other states for a fee.
