1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13105, sub-§2, ¶C,** as amended by PL 2005, c. 19, §2, is
3 further amended to read:

4 C. The development of new commercial products and the fabrication of such
5 products in the State through the Maine Technology Institute under section 15302
6 and the technology centers under section 15321; ~~and~~

7 **Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §13105, sub-§2, ¶D,** as enacted by PL 2003, c. 673, Pt. M, §8,
8 is amended to read:

9 D. Research opportunities that create sustained, interinstitutional, multidisciplinary
10 efforts; ~~and~~

11 **Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §13105, sub-§2, ¶E** is enacted to read:

12 E. The development of innovative approaches leading to environmental and
13 economic sustainability, including:

- 14 (1) Energy efficiency and carbon reduction;
15 (2) Toxics and hazardous waste reduction;
16 (3) Developing environmental leader programs and encouraging technical
17 assistance and mentoring with environmental leaders;
18 (4) Encouraging environmentally preferable purchasing;
19 (5) Piloting innovative environmental compliance outreach;
20 (6) Facilitating the implementation of environmental management systems
21 through site visits and other assistance to ensure a good facility fit;
22 (7) Developing multimedia compliance models including outreach material,
23 checklists for site visits and pollution prevention guidance and materials;
24 (8) Providing multimedia process energy and environmental mapping and other
25 assistance as needed;
26 (9) Coordinating with various state media bureaus to incorporate developing
27 regulatory policies, rules and legislation;
28 (10) Using compliance incentive policies to ensure compliance and pollution
29 prevention assistance to small businesses; and
30 (11) Coordinating assistance efforts with other state agencies as needed.

31 **Sec. 4. Transfer of duties.** The Commissioner of Environmental Protection and
32 the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development shall coordinate to ensure
33 that the duties, functions and responsibilities of the Department of Environmental
34 Protection, Office of Innovation and Assistance are transferred in a timely manner to the
35 Department of Economic and Community Development, Office of Innovation. The
36 Department of Economic and Community Development, Office of Innovation shall

1 assume the duties, functions and responsibilities transferred to it in this Act within
2 existing budgeted resources.

3 **Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and
4 allocations are made.

18 **SUMMARY**

19 This bill eliminates the Department of Environmental Protection, Office of
20 Innovation and Assistance and transfers the duties of that office to the Department of
21 Economic and Community Development, Office of Innovation. This bill also eliminates
22 funding for a total of 7 positions within the Department of Environmental Protection, 5 of
23 which are associated with the Office of Innovation and Assistance and 2 whose duties
24 include serving as legislative liaisons for the department.
