1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§2**, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 687, Pt. A, §5 and
3 affected by Pt. B, §11, is amended to read:

4 **2. Associated equipment.** "Associated equipment" means any component part used,
5 or intended for use, in a slot machine or gaming device, including, but not limited to,
6 software, integrated circuit chips, printed wired assemblies, printed wired boards, printing
7 mechanisms, video display monitors and metering devices.

8 **Sec. 2. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§2-A** is enacted to read:

9 **2-A. Bazaar game.** "Bazaar game" means a game, sport, amusement, diversion,
10 scheme, plan, project, contest, undertaking or enterprise in which chance, fortune, luck or
11 lot is the predominating factor or element in the winning or awarding of a prize but does
12 not include a lottery or any game, sport, amusement, diversion, scheme, plan, project,
13 contest, undertaking or enterprise in which the skill, accomplishment, art or adroitness of
14 the gaming operator or participant is the primary factor in the winning or awarding of a
15 prize.

16 **Sec. 3. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§5-A** is enacted to read:

17 **5-A. Casino.** "Casino" means a facility in Oxford County where activities take
18 place, including, but not limited to, various forms of gaming, amusement, entertainment,
19 music, shows, lodging and any other activities authorized under state law.

20 **Sec. 4. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§16**, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 687, Pt. A, §5 and
21 affected by Pt. B, §11, is amended to read:

22 **16. Gambling facility.** "Gambling facility" means a race track, off-track betting
23 facility, high-stakes beano or beano facility, a game of chance facility or slot machine
24 facility or gaming facility.

25 **Sec. 5. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§19-A** is enacted to read:

26 **19-A. Gaming.** "Gaming" means any game of chance or other gaming activity or
27 wagering activity, including, but not limited to, those activities specifically identified in
28 subsection 19-B.

29 **Sec. 6. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§19-B** is enacted to read:

30 **19-B. Gaming activity.** "Gaming activity" means the act of gambling or wagering
31 something of value at a gaming table, slot machine, simulcast or other device that, upon
32 the placing of a wager or insertion of a coin, token, credit or similar object or thing of
33 value, is available to play or operate, the play or operation of which by the element of
34 chance may deliver the person playing or operating the gaming table, video screen or
35 device, contrivance or machine or entitle that person to receive cash, tokens or credits to
36 be exchanged for cash, merchandise or anything of value, whether the payoff is made by

1 a gaming employee of the operator or automatically from the device, contrivance or
2 machine or in any other manner.

3 **Sec. 7. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§19-C** is enacted to read:

4 **19-C. Gaming device.** "Gaming device" means a device used in any form of
5 gaming, including without limitation the following: a slot machine, card game, table
6 game or other game of chance, including without limitation blackjack, poker, dice,
7 roulette, baccarat, money-wheels and bingo; a bazaar game, but only if conducted solely
8 for merchandise prizes; a lottery game; a video facsimile, including without limitation a
9 video facsimile of any card game, table game or other game of chance, including without
10 limitation those described in this subsection. "Gaming device" applies only to a gaming
11 facility and does not apply to a commercial track, which may operate only slot machines.

12 **Sec. 8. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§19-D** is enacted to read:

13 **19-D. Gaming device distributor.** "Gaming device distributor" means a person
14 who is licensed under this chapter to distribute gaming devices and associated equipment
15 for use in this State.

16 **Sec. 9. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§20,** as enacted by PL 2003, c. 687, Pt. A, §5 and
17 affected by Pt. B, §11, is amended to read:

18 **20. Gaming employee.** "Gaming employee" means any person connected directly
19 with a gambling facility, including cashiers, change personnel, counting room personnel,
20 hosts, dealers, persons who extend credit or offer complimentary services, machine
21 mechanics, security personnel, supervisors or managers. "Gaming employee" also
22 includes employees of a slot machine distributor or gaming device distributor whose
23 duties are directly involved with repair or distribution of slot machines or gaming
24 devices.

25 **Sec. 10. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§20-A** is enacted to read:

26 **20-A. Gaming equipment.** "Gaming equipment" means a machine or device that is
27 specifically designed or manufactured for use in the operation of any gaming activity.

28 **Sec. 11. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§20-B** is enacted to read:

29 **20-B. Gaming facility.** "Gaming facility" means the place that houses the single
30 casino in Oxford County. "Gaming facility" does not include a commercial track.

31 **Sec. 12. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§20-C** is enacted to read:

32 **20-C. Gaming operation.** "Gaming operation" means an enterprise operated by a
33 gaming operator on a gaming site for the conduct of gaming in a gaming facility.

34 **Sec. 13. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§20-D** is enacted to read:

35 **20-D. Gaming operator.** "Gaming operator" means a corporation, partnership,
36 limited partnership, limited liability company or other entity established for the purpose

1 of developing, owning or operating a gaming facility or gaming facilities on one gaming
2 site or a gaming operation or gaming operations, including operation of slot machines, all
3 of the equity and voting securities of which are owned beneficially, directly or indirectly,
4 by a gaming operator.

5 **Sec. 14. 8 MRSA §1001, sub-§20-E** is enacted to read:

6 **20-E. Gaming school.** "Gaming school" means an enterprise organized to provide
7 specialized training to gaming employees for the conduct of gaming other than a training
8 program operated by the gaming operator.

10 **20-F. Gaming services.** "Gaming services" means the provision of goods or
11 services to a gaming operator directly in connection with the operation of gaming in a
12 gaming facility, including maintenance or security services for the gaming facility; junket
13 services; gaming schools; laboratory testing of gaming equipment, including video
14 facsimile machines and lottery tickets; and the manufacture, distribution, maintenance or
15 repair of gaming equipment. "Gaming services" does not include professional or
16 financial services provided by persons licensed or registered under the laws of this State,
17 the Federal Government or other states of the United States.

19 **20-G. Gaming site.** "Gaming site" means one or more contiguous parcels of land
20 selected by a gaming operator and owned or leased by a gaming operator within a single

29 gaming operator license or a slot machine distributor or gaming device distributor license.

3 restaurant concessions or food service.

19 tracking systems to include cashless technology as approved by the board;

20 E. Be incapable of altering the statistical awards of slot machines and gaming
21 devices, as designated by the slot machine or gaming device manufacturer and
22 approved by the board;

23 F. Provide redundancy to ensure that each component of the network is capable of
24 operating independently if another component of the network fails and to ensure that
25 all transactional data is captured and secured; and

26 G. Have the ability to meet the reporting and control requirements set forth in section
27 1003, subsection 2, paragraphs A to T.

10 **1. Location.** Gaming and gaming activities at a casino are allowed only at the
11 gaming facility located in Oxford County.

12 **2. A gaming operator may operate gaming devices.** Notwithstanding any other
13 provision of law, a gaming operator may operate gaming devices on one gaming site.

14 **3. Regulation.** Regulation of gaming and gaming activities at the gaming site must
15 be conducted by the board under this subchapter and the rules adopted pursuant to this
16 subchapter.

17 **4. Liability.** A gaming operator or any 3rd party is not liable or responsible for any
18 act or omission of a gaming operator except as specifically provided by a contract to
19 which the gaming operator or the 3rd party is a signatory or otherwise as provided by law
20 without regard to this chapter.

21 **Sec. 41. 8 MRSA §1011-A** is enacted to read:

22 **§1011-A. License to operate gaming devices at gaming facility**

23 The board shall exercise authority over the licensing of all persons participating in the
24 operation, distribution and maintenance of gaming devices and gaming facilities and over
25 the registration of gaming devices.

26 **1. Operator license required.** A person may not operate any gaming device in the
27 State unless the person has been issued a license to operate gaming devices by the board.
28 A gaming device operator license authorizes a licensee to own or lease gaming devices
29 operated at a licensed gambling facility.

30 **2. Eligible persons.** The board may accept applications for a license to operate
31 gaming devices from any person who is licensed to operate a gaming facility as long as
32 the facility satisfies the following criteria:

33 A. The gaming facility is located in Oxford County in a municipality chosen by a
34 gaming operator;

35 B. The operation of gaming devices at the gaming facility is approved by the voters
36 of Oxford County and the municipality in which the gaming facility to be licensed is

1 located by referendum election held at any time after November 3, 2009 and before
2 December 31, 2011; and

3 C. The legislative body of each city, town or plantation in which the gaming facility
4 is located has approved the gaming site for the conduct of all gaming operations
5 permitted under this chapter.

6 **3. Requirements for license; continued gaming facility licensure.** The board may
7 not issue a license to operate gaming devices to any person unless that person
8 demonstrates compliance with the qualifications set forth in sections 1016 and 1019. A
9 person who is granted a license to operate gaming devices shall maintain a license to
10 operate a gaming facility without lapse, suspension or revocation for the duration of the
11 gaming operator's license.

12 **4. Requirement for license; agreement with municipality where gaming devices**
13 **are located.** A gaming operator shall enter into an agreement with the municipality
14 where the gaming operator's gaming devices are located that provides for revenue sharing
15 or other compensation, including, but not limited to, a provision requiring the preparation,
16 in conjunction with the municipality, of a security plan for the premises on which the
17 gaming devices are located.

18 **5. Renewal.** Licenses to operate gaming devices may be renewed upon application
19 for renewal in accordance with this subchapter subject to board rules.

20 **-Sec. 42. 8 MRSA §1012,** as enacted by PL 2003, c. 687, Pt. A, §5 and affected by
21 Pt. B, §11, is amended to read:

22 **§1012. Local approval for renewal of gaming or slot machine operator license**

23 An application for renewal of a gaming operator or slot machine operator license
24 must first be approved under this section by the municipal officers of the municipality in
25 which the gaming facility or commercial track with slot machines is located or, if the
26 gaming facility or commercial track is in an unincorporated place, the application must be
27 approved by the county commissioners of the county in which the gaming facility or
28 commercial track with slot machines is located.

29 **1. Hearings.** Municipal officers or county commissioners, as the case may be, may
30 hold a public hearing for the consideration of a request for the renewal of a license to
31 operate gaming devices or slot machines, except that, when an applicant has held a
32 license for the prior 5 years and a complaint has not been filed with the board against the
33 applicant within that time, the applicant may request a waiver of the hearing.

34 A. The board shall prepare and supply application forms for public hearings under
35 this subsection.

36 B. Municipal officers or county commissioners, as the case may be, shall provide
37 public notice of any hearing held under this section by causing, at the applicant's
38 prepaid expense, a notice stating the name and place of the hearing to appear on at
39 least 3 consecutive days before the date of the hearing in a daily newspaper having
40 general circulation in the municipality where the premises of the gaming facility or
41 commercial track with slot machines are located or one week before the date of the

1 hearing in a weekly newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where
2 the premises are located.

3 C. If municipal officers or county commissioners, as the case may be, fail to take
4 final action on an application for a renewal of a gaming operator or slot machine
5 operator license within 60 days of the filing of an application, the application is
6 considered approved and ready for action by the board. For purposes of this
7 paragraph, the date of filing of the application is the date the application is received
8 by the municipal officers or county commissioners.

9 **2. Findings.** In granting or denying an application under this section, municipal
10 officers or the county commissioners shall indicate the reasons for their decision and
11 provide a copy to the applicant. A license may be denied on one or more of the following
12 grounds:

13 A. Noncompliance of the gaming facility or commercial track licensed to operate
14 slot machines with any local zoning ordinance or other land use ordinance not
15 directly related to gaming device or slot machine operations;

16 B. Conditions of record such as waste disposal violations, health or safety violations
17 or repeated parking or traffic violations on or in the vicinity of the premises of the
18 gaming facility or commercial track with slot machines and caused by persons
19 patronizing or employed by the gaming facility or commercial track licensed to
20 operate slot machines or other such conditions caused by persons patronizing or
21 employed by the premises that unreasonably disturb, interfere with or affect the
22 ability of persons or businesses residing or located in the vicinity of the premises to
23 use their property in a reasonable manner;

24 C. Repeated incidents of record of breaches of the peace, disorderly conduct,
25 vandalism or other violations of law on or in the vicinity of the premises of the
26 gaming facility or commercial track with slot machines and caused by persons
27 patronizing or employed by the gaming facility or commercial track licensed to
28 operate slot machines; and

29 D. A violation of any provision of this chapter.

32 **SUMMARY**

33 This bill authorizes a gaming operator to operate a gaming facility at a single site in
34 Oxford County. The legislative body and voters of any municipality in which the site is
35 located must approve the site for the operation of the gaming facility. The gaming
36 facility is authorized to contain slot machines, bazaar games conducted solely for
37 merchandise prizes, lottery games, video facsimiles, card games, table games and other
38 games of chance, including without limitation blackjack, poker, dice, roulette, baccarat,
39 money-wheels and bingo. The initiated bill removes the limit on the total number of slot
40 machines that are allowed to be registered in this State. The bill provides that, other than
41 the approved commercial race tracks in the State that operate slot machines, the gaming

1 facility must be the only gaming facility in the State for at least 10 years. The bill
2 provides for regulation of the gaming facility by the Department of Public Safety,
3 Gambling Control Board.

4 The bill requires the gaming operator to pay to the State 40% of the total gross
5 gaming device income. This money paid to the State must be used for the following
6 purposes:

7 1. Nineteen and one half percent of the total gross gaming device income must be
8 distributed to economic development funds to be used for statewide projects and projects
9 in Oxford County;

10 2. Nineteen and one half percent of the total gross gaming device income must be
11 distributed to transportation infrastructure funds to be used for statewide projects and
12 projects in Oxford County; and
