The department shall reimburse a participating conservation organization \$25 per coyote bounty paid by the organization with funds received pursuant to the federal Pittman-Robertson |
| 7 8 9 | Wildlife Restoration Act, 16 United States Code, Sections 669 to 669k (1937). Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5. chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. |

| 12 13 | There is an open season for trapping coyotes in all counties of the State from October 15th to February 15th. |

| 16 17 | 1. It authorizes the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to adopt rules to establish a coyote bounty system; |
| 18 19 | 2. It provides that coyote bounties be paid from federal funding received from the federal Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act; and |
| 20 | 3. It sets a coyote trapping season from October 15th to February 15th. |
