17	Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 4 and 5.

19 20 21	This amendment is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. It protects from release e-mail addresses collected and used by a political subdivision in a noninteractive way to provide information to subscribers. The amendment deletes
