2 3	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10001, sub-§28, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 414, Pt. A, §2 and affected by c. 614, §9, is amended to read:
4 5 6 7	28. Guide. "Guide" means a person who receives any form of remuneration for that person's services in accompanying or assisting a person in the fields, or forests or on the waters or ice within the jurisdiction of the State while hunting, fishing, trapping, boating, snowmobiling, using an all-terrain vehicle or camping at a primitive camping area.

9 10 11	This bill amends the inland fisheries and wildlife laws to add using an all-terrain vehicle to the list of activities a guide accompanies or assists a person with for remuneration.
