11	Amend the bill by inserting before section 1 the following:

In recognition of the interests of the federally recognized Indian tribes in this State in their archaeologic heritage and in accordance with the requirements of federal law, including the Nation Historic Preservation Act of 1996, as amended, and the federal Native American Grav Protection and Repatriation Act, the Maine Historic Preservation Commission and the State Museum shall consult with federally recognized Indian tribes in this State concerning adequate and appropriate curation of archaeological materials excavated fro protected sites.'

The directors of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission and the State Museum shall jointly adopt rules establishing standards and procedures for obtaining the data, and main impose reasonable requirements on its use, including requirements of confidentiality

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 135, L.D. 160

The directors of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission and the State Museum shall establish procedures for reviewing no less frequently than once every 10 years information designated as confidential under this section in order to determine whether continued confidentiality is necessary and, if not, to remove the confidentiality designation.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment makes the following changes to the bill.

- 1. It requires the directors of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission and the Maine State Museum to establish procedures for reviewing at least once every 10 years site location information designated as confidential in order to determine whether continued confidentiality is necessary and, if not, to remove the confidentiality designation.
- 2. It requires the Maine Historic Preservation Commission and the Maine State Museum to consult with representatives of the Passamaquoddy Tribe, the Penobscot Nation, the Houlton Band of Maliseet Indians and the Aroostook Band of Micmacs with regard to the adequate and appropriate curation of Native American artifacts recovered from protected sites, as defined in the bill.
