1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2601, sub-§11 is enacted to read:
3	11. Traffic summonses; fine reduced. For a person who has received a Violation
4	Summons and Complaint for a traffic infraction, if the person files with the violations
5	bureau a written answer that does not contest the traffic infraction, the fine is reduced by
6	10%.
7	SUMMARY
8 9	This bill provides that if a person files a written answer to the judicial branch's violations bureau that does not contest a traffic infraction, the fine is reduced by 10%.
