COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 247, L.D. 342, Bill, "An Act To Waive Driver's License and Nondriver Identification Card Fees for Current and Recently Discharged Members of the Armed Forces"

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 2 in the first and 2nd lines (page 1, lines 9 and 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "~~30 days~~ 2 years" and inserting the following: '~~30~~ 180 days'

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the amount of time within which a person released or discharged from the United State Armed Forces may obtain a driver's license or nondriver identification card without paying a fee from 2 years as proposed in the bill to 180 days.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This legislation eliminates the nondriver identification card fee for a person who has served in the United States Armed Forces for a period of 180 days after discharge or release and extends the elimination of the driver's license fee for these members from 30 to 180 days after discharge or release. These provisions would reduce Highway Fund revenues by minor amounts not requiring any change to the budget.
