2 3	<b>Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10952, sub-§2,</b> as enacted by PL 2011, c. 61, §1, is amended to read:
4 5 6	<b>2.</b> Hunting with a crossbow; 60 years of age or older. A person 70 60 years of age or older may hunt a wild bird or a wild animal with a crossbow during any open season on that wild bird or wild animal subject to the laws of this Part.
7	This subsection is repealed January 1, 2015.
8	SUMMARY
9 10 11	Current law allows a person 70 years of age or older to hunt a wild bird or wild animal with a crossbow during any open season; the provision is repealed January 1, 2015.
12 13	This bill extends the provision to a person 60 years of age or older and removes the repeal.
