Notwithstanding this section, confidential information may be disclosed to law enforcement officers and issuing authorities for criminal justice and permitting purposes. After April 30, 2013, an application for a permit filed or granted on or after the effective date of this resolve and on or before April 30, 2013 will be governed by the law in effect on and after April 30, 2013'

23 24 25 26 27 28	This amendment removes language that prohibits the redistribution or dissemination of information received regarding handgun permits, clarifies that the moratorium on access does not apply to law enforcement officers and issuing authorities for criminal justice and permitting purposes and clarifies that applications for permits filed or granted after the effective date of the resolve and on or before April 30, 2013 are governed by the law in effect on and after April 30, 2013.
