1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11212, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2005, c. 477, §9, is further amended to read:
4 5	1. Prohibition. The following provisions apply to shooting from a motor vehicle or motorboat or possessing a loaded firearm or a crossbow in a motor vehicle.
6 7	A. A person may not shoot while in or on a motor vehicle or motorboat or while in or on a trailer or other type of vehicle being hauled by a motor vehicle except:
8 9	(1) A person may hunt migratory waterfowl from a motorboat in accordance with federal regulations;
10 11	(2) Paraplegics and single or double amputees of the legs may shoot from motor vehicles that are not in motion; and
12 13	(3) A person may shoot from a motorboat if that boat is not being propelled by its motor- <u>; and</u>
14 15	(4) A person may shoot from a motor vehicle or motorboat in defense of life or property.

A person may not, while in or on a motor vehicle or in or on a trailer or other type of vehicle being hauled by a motor vehicle, have a cocked and armed crossbow or a firearm with a cartridge or shell in the chamber or in an attached magazine, clip or cylinder or a muzzle-loading firearm charged with powder, lead and a primed ignition device or mechanism, except that a person who has a valid Maine permit to carry a concealed weapon may have in or on a motor vehicle or trailer a loaded pistol or revolver covered by that permit.
23 24	C. A person may not possess a wild animal or wild bird taken in violation of paragraph A $\frac{\text{or }B}{\text{or }B}$, except as otherwise provided in this Part.

27	Sec. 3. 25 MRSA §2001-B is enacted to read:
28	§2001-B. Threatening display of dangerous weapon
29 30 31	A person may not, unless excepted by a provision of law, display in a threatening manner a firearm, slungshot, knuckles, bowie knife, dirk, stiletto or other dangerous or deadly weapon usually employed in the attack on or defense of a person.
32 33	Sec. 4. 25 MRSA §2004, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. N, §3 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is amended to read:
34 35	2. Display of dangerous weapon. A person who violates section 2001-A 2001-B commits a Class D crime.

1 2	Sec. 5. 25 MRSA §2004, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. N, §3 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is repealed.
3 4	Sec. 6. 25 MRSA §2005, sub-§1, ¶B, as amended by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. N, §4 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is repealed.
5	SUMMARY
6	This bill:
7 8	1. Removes the prohibition on having a loaded firearm or crossbow in a motor vehicle for a person other than a holder of a concealed weapons permit;
9 10	2. Provides the exception that a person may shoot from a motor vehicle or motorboat in the defense of life or property;
11	3. Removes the prohibition on concealing a dangerous weapon; and
12 13	4. Removes exceptions to the law prohibiting the carrying of a concealed dangerous weapon.
