Effective July 1, 1999 and every July thereafter, the State Court Administrator shall adjust the salaries of the State's chijustices, chief judge, deputy chief judge, associate justices and associate judges by an percentage change in the Consumer Price Index from January 1st to December 31st of the previous year, but only to a maximum increase of 4% 3%. The State Court Administration shall determine the cost of these adjustments; notify the State Budget Officer and the Director of the Office of Fiscal and Program Review of these costs; and include them the Judicial Department's budget requests, as necessary. For purposes of this subsection "Consumer Price Index" means the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers: United States City Average, All items, 1967=100, as compiled by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics or, if the index is revise or superseded, the Consumer Price Index is the index represented by the Bureau of Labor Statistics as reflecting most accurately changes in the purchasing power of the dollar consumers.'

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment, which lowers the upper limit for the cost-of-living-adjustments from 4% to 3% that are used to calculate the Judicial Department's Personal Services costs in the Biennial Budget requests, will reduce future Personal Services baseline budget appropriations by \$94,895 in fiscal year 2015-16 and \$196,433 in fiscal year 2016-17.
