19 20 21 22 23	The Maine Farm-to-Plate Commission established in Title 5, section 12004-L subsection 1-C and referred to in this section as "the commission," is established to advise the commissioner on critical issues of agricultural regulation, food safety and local and regional food-related issues. Membership and duties of the commission are set forth in this section.
24	1. Members. The commission consists of members appointed as follows:
25 26 27	A. One representative of the University of Maine Cooperative Extension, who serves as chair of the commission, appointed by the Chancellor of the University of Maine System;
28 29 30	B. One member of a statewide organization dedicated to ensuring food for the State's future, jointly appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
31 32 33	C. One member of a statewide organization dedicated to ensuring sustainable agriculture in the State, jointly appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

One member of a statewide organization dedicated to organic farming and 1 gardening, jointly appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 2 3 House of Representatives; and 4 E. One member of a statewide organization organized to strengthen the State's 5 farming, fishing and food economy, jointly appointed by the President of the Senate 6 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. 7 The commission shall invite as members 2 small-scale farm owners, 2 large-scale farm 8 owners, one small-scale producer of prepared food, one large-scale producer of prepared 9 food, one member representing a local or regional food policy council, one member 10 representing a statewide organization dedicated to encouraging tourism in the State and 11 one member representing a statewide organization dedicated to aquaculture in the State. 2. Terms. Each member of the commission serves for a term of 3 years. If a 12 13 member is unable to complete the term, the appointing authority shall appoint a person to 14 serve out the remainder of the unexpired term. 15 3. **Duties.** The commission shall: 16 Advise and assist the commissioner in the implementation and oversight of 17 initiatives recommended by the commission; 18 B. By February 1st annually, submit a report concerning the commission's activities 19 to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 20 Representatives, the Clerk of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives 21 and the chairs of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 22 over agriculture, conservation and forestry matters; and 23 Periodically review and update the strategic plan for agricultural economic 24 development developed in accordance with subsection 4. 25 4. Strategic plan. The commission shall develop a strategic plan for agricultural 26 economic development. In developing the strategic plan, the commission shall: 27 A. Inventory the State's food system infrastructure by gathering existing data, studies 28 and analysis about: 29 (1) The types of foods produced in the State, the number of producers of each 30 type of food, the amount of each type of food produced and the financial viability 31 of each food-producing sector; 32 (2) The types of food processors in the State, how much food produced in the 33 State is purchased by processors within the State and the financial viability of the 34 food processing sector in the State;

The commission may seek and accept gifts, donations and grants from any public or private source to support farm-to-table direct marketing, including farmers' markets and community-supported agriculture operations and to support and encourage so-called regional community food hubs. The commission may use technical assistance, loans, grants or other means approved by the commissioner.
25 26 27	Sec. 2. Development of strategic plan. The Maine Farm-to-Plate Commission shall develop the strategic plan for agricultural economic development pursuant to Title 7, section 219, subsection 4 by November 1, 2014.
28 29 30 31 32	Sec. 3. Report. The Maine Farm-to-Plate Commission shall investigate the feasibility, logistics and propriety of instituting in the State food sovereignty under which local governments may regulate local food systems by local ordinance. The commission shall submit a report of its findings to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry no later than January 1, 2014.'

34	This amendment strikes the committee amendment and replaces it with language that:
