Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

19	SUMMARY
20	This bill prohibits the slaughter of horses for human consumption and:
21 22 23	1. Bans the possession, sale, purchase, transportation and import into or export out of this State of a horse if the person knows or should know that the horse is meant to be slaughtered for human consumption;
24 25 26	2. Bans the possession, sale, purchase, transportation, import into or export out of this State of horseflesh if the person knows or should know that the horseflesh is for human consumption;
27 28	3. Bans the construction or operation of a facility that the person knows or should know is used or will be used for the slaughter of horses for human consumption; and
29 30	4. Repeals current law that allows horsemeat to be sold in this State as long as it is plainly and conspicuously labeled as such.
