11 12	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:	:
13	'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4011-A, sub-§7 is enacted to read:	
14	7. Children under 6 months of age or otherwise nonambulatory. A person	
15 16	required to make a report under subsection 1 shall report to the department if a child who is under 6 months of age or otherwise nonambulatory exhibits evidence of the following:	
17	A. Fracture of a bone;	
18	B. Substantial bruising or multiple bruises;	
19	C. Subdural hematoma;	
20	D. Burns;	
21	E. Poisoning; or	
22 23	F. Injury resulting in substantial bleeding, soft tissue swelling or impairment of an organ.'	
24	SUMMARY	
25	This amendment removes from the bill the training requirement for mandated	
26 27	reporters. It removes "failure to thrive" from the list of required reportable	
27 28	circumstances. It removes the provision that makes failure to report a Class E crime and the provision that permits the Commissioner of Health and Human Services to revoke a	
29	youth camp license for failure to report suspected child abuse or neglect.
