10 11	Amend the amendment in section 4 in §6114 by striking out all of subsection 5 (page 3, lines 26 to 30 in amendment) and inserting the following:
12	'5. Rescission. The commission shall establish by rule a process by which:
13 14 15	A. Customers of a consumer-owned water utility may petition the commission to rescind an exemption granted under this section to an individual consumer-owned water utility or to a class of consumer-owned water utilities; and
16 17 18	B. The commission may on its own motion rescind an exemption granted under this section to an individual consumer-owned water utility or to a class of consumer-owned water utilities.
19 20	A rescission may be in whole or in part and may be specific to an individual consumer- owned water utility.'
21	SUMMARY
22	This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A." The amendment authorizes
23	the Public Utilities Commission to rescind an exemption on its own motion.

## **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The amendment explicitly allows the Public Utilities Commission (PUC), on its own motion without a petition, to rescind an exemption to an individual consumer-owned water utility or a class of consumer-owned water utilities from certain regulations under Title 35-A. Any additional costs to the PUC are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
