The joint standing committee may submit a bill related to the subject matter of the report to the First Regular Session of the 127th Legislature.

28 29 30 31 32	This bill creates a temporary consumer advisor position in the Office of the Public Advocate to advise citizens participating in proceedings before the Public Utilities Commission. The position is established to address a recommendation in the Office of Program Evaluation and Government Accountability's 2013 report on the Public Utilities Commission that the Public Utilities Commission and the Public Advocate explore ways

commission that the Public Utilities Commission and the Public Advocate explore ways to facilitate consumers' ability to effectively represent themselves in adjudicatory proceedings before the Public Utilities Commission. This bill also requires the Public Advocate to report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and utilities matters on the performance, duties and funding of the consumer advisor.
