**An Act Regarding the Registration of an Antique Motor Vehicle
That Is the Owner's Sole Vehicle**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 29-A MRS** **A §457, sub-§6,** as amended by PL 2005, c. 321, §3 and
3 affected by §6, is further amended to read:

4 **6. Application.** An application for registration of a vehicle under this section must
5 be accompanied by an affidavit that includes a statement indicating the year and make of
6 the motor vehicle and that the vehicle is garaged or maintained in the State.
7 Notwithstanding section 101, subsection 3, paragraph D and subsection 4, paragraph D, if
8 an owner is registering an antique auto or antique motorcycle and the antique auto or
9 antique motorcycle is the owner's sole vehicle, an application for registration must be
10 accompanied by an affidavit that includes a statement indicating the motor vehicle is not
11 used year-round.

12 **SUMMARY**

13 This bill provides that an owner of an antique auto or antique motorcycle may
14 register that vehicle if it is the owner's sole vehicle as long as the owner provides an
15 affidavit stating that the motor vehicle is not used year-round.
