SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 114,
L.D. 156, Bill, "An Act To Lower the Eligibility Age for a Junior Hunting License"

Amend the amendment in section 8 in §11108-C by striking out all of subsection 3
(page 2, lines 34 to 36 in amendment) and inserting the following:

3. Supervision of junior hunters. A hunter who is at least 10 years of age and
under 16 years of age may not hunt unless that person holds a junior hunting license and
is in the presence of and under the effective control of an adult supervisor. A hunter who
is under 10 years of age may not hunt unless that person holds a junior hunting license
and is in the presence of and under the effective control of an adult supervisor who
remains at all times within 20 feet of that hunter.

SUMMARY

This amendment requires that hunters under 10 years of age must:

- 1. Hold a junior hunting license; and
- 2. Be in the presence of and under the effective control of an adult supervisor who remains at all times within 20 feet of the hunter.
