9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 140, L.D. 182, Bill, "An Act To Eliminate Term Limits for Legislators"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

### 'An Act To Increase the Number of Terms a Legislator May Serve'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:

- 'Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §553, sub-§§1 and 2, as enacted by IB 1993, c. 1, §1 and affected by §2, are amended to read:
  - 1. State Senate. A person may not serve more than -4 6 consecutive terms as a state State Senator or more than 12 consecutive years, whichever is less in duration.
  - 2. State Representative. A person may not serve more than 4 6 consecutive terms as a member of the state State House of Representatives or more than 12 consecutive years, whichever is less in duration.'

#### 22 SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It replaces the bill and instead increases the amount of time that a State Senator and State Representative may serve from 4 consecutive terms, as in current law, to 6 consecutive terms or 12 consecutive years, whichever is less in duration.
