1 **5. Rules.** The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this chapter. Rules
2 adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter
3 375, subchapter 2-A.

4 **§19302. Digital texts and online courses**

5 **1. Application.** To offer a digital text or online course through the digital portal for
6 education, a provider shall apply to the commissioner in a form and manner prescribed by
7 the commissioner. The application for each digital text or online course must:

8 A. Describe the digital text or online course in as much detail as required by the
9 commissioner;

10 B. Indicate whether an instructor is provided;

11 C. Indicate the qualifications and credentials of the instructor or the developer of the
12 digital text or online course;

13 D. Indicate the number of hours of instruction the digital text or online course
14 requires;

15 E. Indicate whether the digital text or online course has been peer reviewed; and

16 F. Include any additional information that the commissioner may require.

17 **2. Approval.** The commissioner shall review applications received under subsection
18 1 and may approve or reject applications for digital texts or online courses to be included
19 in the digital portal for education.

20 **3. Catalog of digital texts and online courses.** The commissioner shall catalog
21 each digital text or online course approved for the digital portal for education in a print or
22 electronic medium made available publicly. The catalog must include:

23 A. The information provided under subsection 1 and any other information necessary
24 for a school administrative unit, private school, public or private postsecondary
25 institution or individual to decide whether to enroll in or subscribe to the digital text
26 or online course; and

27 B. Instructions for enrolling in or subscribing to the digital text or online course,
28 including deadlines for enrollment or subscription.

29 **§19303. Fees**

30 **1. Expenses borne by provider.** Any expense related to the installation of a digital
31 text or online course onto the digital portal for education must be paid by the digital text
32 or online course provider.

33 **2. Fee set by provider.** The provider of a digital text or online course shall set the
34 fee charged for that digital text or online course offered through the digital portal for
35 education.
