

Delay of Legislative Cost/Study

Legislative Cost/Study

Removing the emergency preamble and clause from the bill will eliminate the \$625 estimated fiscal year 2015-16 general operating costs of this study and increase the fiscal year 2016-17 estimated costs by \$625, resulting in an estimated fiscal year 2016-17 cost of \$2,750. The Legislature's budget includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2016-17 for legislative studies. Whether this amount is sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.
