1	C. Purposely omit or conceal a material fact related to the testimony.
2 3	3. Penalty. A lobbyist or lobbyist associate who violates subsection 2 commits a Class E crime.
4 5 6 7	4. Suspension. The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices may suspend a lobbyist or lobbyist associate who violates subsection 2 from further lobbying before the Legislature for a period of up to 2 years, in addition to any penalty imposed pursuant to subsection 3.'

9 10 11	This amendment is a minority report of the committee. The amendment removes the provision of the bill that allows a member of a legislative committee to place a person providing testimony under oath.
