Amend the bill in section 1 in §419-E in subsection 1 in paragraph C in the 2nd and 3rd lines (page 1, lines 13 and 14 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "combustion that includes several carcinogens and, when in high quantities, are" and inserting the following: 'combustion, that include several carcinogens and that, in high quantities, are'
Amend the bill in section 1 in §419-E in subsection 2 in the first line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2019" and inserting the following: '2020'
Amend the bill in section 1 in §419-E in subsection 3 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 19 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "2020" and inserting the following: '2021'
SUMMARY
This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, extends by one year the implementation dates for the prohibitions in the bill on the sale of coal tar sealant products and the application of coal tar sealant products and makes a minor technical correction to the bill.
