Assistance under this subsection must be supported with federal block grant funds provided under the United States Social Security Act, Title IV, Part A. The department shall adopt rules relating to proof of employment, proof of an employment-related need for a motor vehicle, household income requirements and verification of motor vehicle repairs.
