9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 488, L.D. 1410, Bill, "An Act To 10 Adopt the Nurse Licensure Compact"

Amend the bill in Part B in section 3 in paragraph L in the first line (page 17, line 29 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>A law enforcement officer</u>" and inserting the following: '<u>The State Police</u>'

Amend the bill in Part B by striking out all of sections 4 and 5 and inserting the following:

Sec. B-4. 25 MRSA §1542-A, sub-§4, as amended by PL 2015, c. 300, Pt. B,
§5, is further amended to read:

18 4. Duty to submit to State Bureau of Identification. It is the duty of the law 19 enforcement agency taking the fingerprints as required by subsection 3, paragraphs A, B 20 and G to transmit immediately to the State Bureau of Identification the criminal 21 fingerprint record. Fingerprints taken pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph C, D, E or F or 22 pursuant to subsection 5 may not be submitted to the State Bureau of Identification unless 23 an express request is made by the commanding officer of the State Bureau of 24 Identification, Fingerprints taken pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph G must be 25 transmitted immediately to the State Bureau of Identification to enable the bureau to 26 conduct state and national criminal history record checks for the Department of 27 Education. The bureau may not use the fingerprints for any purpose other than that 28 provided for under Title 20-A, section 6103. The bureau shall retain the fingerprints, 29 except as provided under Title 20-A, section 6103, subsection 9. Fingerprints taken 30 pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph I and subsection 3, paragraph I must be transmitted 31 immediately to the State Bureau of Identification to enable the bureau to conduct state 32 and national criminal history record checks for the court and the Department of Public 33 Safety, Gambling Control Board, respectively. Fingerprints taken pursuant to subsection 34 1, paragraph J, K or L must be transmitted immediately to the State Bureau of 35 Identification to enable the bureau to conduct state and national criminal history record 36 checks for the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of Revenue 37 Services. Fingerprints taken pursuant to subsection 1, paragraph M must be transmitted

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The bill includes Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$28,502 beginning in fiscal year 2017-18 to the Department of Public Safety to perform fingerprint-based criminal history background checks. Other Special Revenue Funds revenue to the Department of Public Safety will be increased by \$41,600 beginning in fiscal year 2017-18. This estimate assumes an additional 800 fingerprints will be taken each year.

Additional costs to the State Board of Nursing, affiliated with the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, to implement the provisions in this legislation can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
