2 3	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-X, sub-§4, ¶¶H and I, as enacted by PL 2015, c. 511, §1, are amended to read:

In the case of an eligible member who qualifies for health insurance coverage under the federal Affordable Care Act, as defined in Title 24-A, section 14, during a special enrollment period pursuant to 45 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 155.420, support that eligible member in applying for federal Affordable Care Act special enrollment health insurance coverage to be paid for by the eligible member.
