This amendment expands the pool of providers eligible to apply for the program to include all social workers licensed 28 29 by the State Board of Social Worker Licensure and all counselors licensed by the Board of Counseling Professionals Licensure and expands the categories of underserved practice 30 areas to include federally qualified health centers, community-based behavioral health 31 centers and organizations exempt from taxation under the United States Internal Revenue 32 Code of 1986, Section 501(c)(6). 33

The amendment further clarifies that the program is funded through a one-time appropriation of \$1,000,000, rather than an ongoing appropriation as in the bill.

This bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2017-18 to a newly created Maine Mental Health Providers Loan Repayment Fund within the Finance Authority of Maine as part of a new Maine Mental Health Providers Loan Repayment Program established to provide up to 3 qualified applicants with \$5,000 per year for a period of 5 years to assist the applicant in the repayment of student loans.
