2 **Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and
3 allocations are made.

4 **UNIVERSITY OF MAINE SYSTEM, BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE**
5 **Educational and General Activities - UMS 0031**

6 Initiative: Provides one-time funding to support a 3-year study of the browntail moth
7 infestation. Funds appropriated for this purpose do not lapse but must be carried forward
8 into the next fiscal year to be used only to support the cost of the study.
