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The amendment strikes and replaces the General Fund appropriations in the bill with Fund for a Healthy Maine allocations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$627,421 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$1,004,842 in fiscal year 2020-21 for a 24 month pilot project to provide rapid access to low-barrier treatment for substance use disorders and stable housing to support recovery and create stability for 50 opioid users who are among the most vulnerable and unstable in the State.
