1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §2143, sub-§4,** as amended by PL 2013, c. 315, §8, is repealed.

3 **SUMMARY**

4 This bill, which is reported out by the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and  
5 Natural Resources pursuant to Joint Order 2019, House Paper 883, implements the  
6 Department of Environmental Protection's recommendations regarding the State's cellular  
7 telephone recycling law as included in the department's annual report on the State's  
8 product stewardship programs.

9 The bill amends the State's cellular telephone recycling law to remove the  
10 requirement that cellular telephone service providers submit annual reports to the  
11 department regarding the collection and disposal, reuse or recycling of used cellular  
12 telephones.

13 The committee has not taken a position on the substance of the bill and by reporting  
14 this bill out, the committee is not suggesting and does not intend to suggest that it agrees  
15 or disagrees with any aspect of this bill. The committee is reporting the bill out for the  
16 sole purpose of obtaining a printed bill that can be referred to the committee for a public  
17 hearing and subsequent committee action in the normal course.
