COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1247, L.D. 1752, Bill, "An Act To Amend the Charter of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting the following:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1961, c. 161, as enacted by P&SL 1961, c. 161; and amended by P&SL 1971, c. 54; P&SL 1991, c. 81, §1; P&SL 1993, c. 59, §1; P&SL 1997, c. 14, §1; and P&SL 2005, c. 34, §§1 and 2, is further amended to read:

Sec. 1. Territorial limits; incorporation. The territory and the inhabitants of the Town of Boothbay Harbor in the County of Lincoln and the territory and the inhabitants of the Town of Boothbay in the County of Lincoln constitute a public sewerage district and a body politic and corporate under the name of "Boothbay Harbor Sewer District." The purpose of this district, subject to the provisions of section 10, is to take over, control, operate and manage the sewers now owned by the Town of Boothbay Harbor with all appurtenances thereto; to extend, increase, enlarge and improve these sewers; to extend the present system or systems so as to furnish sewerage facilities to parts of the district not now served with those facilities; to provide for removal and treatment of sewage when, as and if that treatment becomes necessary; and generally to construct, maintain, operate and provide a system of sewerage, sewage disposal and sewage treatment for public purposes and for the health, welfare, comfort and convenience of the inhabitants of the district.

Sec. 2. Authority to locate, construct and maintain; coordination with municipal planning. Within said territory and the territory of any adjoining municipality, said Boothbay Harbor Sewer District is authorized to lay pipes, drains, sewers and conduits, and to take up, repair and maintain the same or to contract for the same to be done, in, along and through any public or private ways and public grounds, and in, along and through lands of any person or corporation as hereafter provided, to and into tidal waters, rivers, watercourses or treatment works or to or into any drain or sewer now or hereafter built which empties into tidal waters, rivers, watercourses or treatment works, the discharge therefrom to be at such points consistent with the requirements of

1 public health as shall be found convenient and reasonable for said district and the flow of
2 existing watercourses; to locate, construct and maintain treatment works, pumping
3 stations, basins, reservoirs, flush tanks and such other appliances for collecting, holding,
4 purifying, distributing and disposing of sewage matter, commercial and industrial waste
5 and, subject to the provisions of section 10, of surface and waste water, all as may be
6 necessary or proper; and in general, do any or all other things necessary or incidental to
7 accomplish the purposes of this act.

8 The coordination of municipal planning and sewer extension planning is governed by
9 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1037, subsection 1.

10 ~~**Sec. 3. Authority to acquire and hold property; right of eminent domain**~~
11 ~~**conferred.**~~ Upon acceptance of this act as hereafter provided, and subject to the
12 provisions of section 10, title to all public sewers in the Town of Boothbay Harbor shall
13 forthwith pass to and be vested in said district, and said district thereafter shall maintain
14 and operate the same. The said district is authorized and empowered to acquire and hold
15 real and personal property necessary or convenient for the purposes of this act, and is
16 expressly granted the right of eminent domain, and for the purposes of this act is
17 authorized to take and hold, either by exercising its right of eminent domain, or by
18 purchase, lease or otherwise, as for public uses any land, real estate, easements or
19 interests therein, and any sewers, drains or conduits and any sewer or drainage rights
20 necessary for constructing, establishing, maintaining and operating sewers, drains,
21 reservoirs, flush tanks, manholes, catch basins, treatment works, pumping stations and
22 other appliances and property used or useful for collecting, holding, purifying,
23 distributing and disposing of sewage matter and industrial waste and surface and waste
24 waters. Nothing herein contained should be construed as authorizing said district to take
25 by right of eminent domain any of the property or facilities of any other public service
26 corporation or district used or required for future use by the owner thereof in the
27 performance of a public duty, unless expressly authorized by subsequent act of the
28 Legislature.

29 **Sec. 3-A. Authority to acquire and hold property; right of eminent**
30 **domain conferred; procedures; damages.** The authority and procedures for the
31 exercise of eminent domain are governed by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section
32 1040.

33 ~~**Sec. 4. Notice; procedure under eminent domain.**~~ In exercising from time to
34 time the right of eminent domain conferred upon it, said district, by its board of trustees,
35 shall file in the office of the county commissioners of Lincoln County and cause to be
36 recorded in the registry of deeds in said county plans of the location of all lands, real
37 estate, easements or interest therein, and sewers, drains or conduits and any sewer or
38 drainage rights to be taken, with an appropriate description and the names of the owners
39 thereof, if known. When for any reason the district fails to acquire property which it is
40 authorized to take and which is described in such location, or if the location so recorded
41 is defective and uncertain, it may, at any time, correct and perfect such location and file a
42 new description thereof, and in such case the district is liable in damages only for
43 property for which the owner had not previously been paid, to be assessed as of the time
44 of the original taking, and the district shall not be liable for any acts which would have
45 been justified if the original taking had been lawful. No entry shall be made on any

1 private lands, except to make surveys, until the expiration of 10 days from such filing,
2 whereupon possession may be had of all said lands, real estate, easements or interests
3 therein and other property and rights as aforesaid to be taken, but title thereto shall not
4 vest in said district until payment therefor.

5 ~~Sec. 5. Assessment of damages by county commissioners; procedure on~~
6 ~~appeals.~~ If any person sustaining damages by any taking as aforesaid shall not agree
7 with said district upon the sum to be paid therefor, either party, upon petition to the
8 county commissioners of Lincoln County, may have said damages assessed by them; the
9 procedure and all subsequent proceedings and right of appeal thereon shall be had under
10 the same restrictions, conditions and limitations as are or may be by law prescribed in the
11 case of damages by the laying out of highways.

12 **Sec. 6. Limitations on crossing a public utility.** In case of crossing of any
13 public utility, unless consent is given by the company owning or operating such public
14 utility as to place, manner and conditions of the crossing within 30 days after such
15 consent is requested by said district, the Public Utilities Commission shall determine the
16 place, manner and conditions of such crossing; and all work on the property of such
17 public utility shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of such public
18 utility, but at the expense of the district. If any sewer line of the district as provided
19 above crosses the property or line of any railroad corporation, the procedure is the same
20 as stated in the previous sentence, except that the Department of Transportation must be
21 substituted for the Public Utilities Commission. Nothing herein contained shall be
22 construed as authorizing said district to take by right of eminent domain any of the
23 property or facilities of any other public service corporation or district used or acquired
24 for future use by the owner thereof in the performance of a public duty unless expressly
25 authorized herein or by subsequent act of the Legislature.

26 **Sec. 7. Rights of abutters or others to enter.** A person not otherwise required
27 to connect a private sewer into a sewer of the district may connect to the district's sewer if
28 that person obtains a permit from the district and pays any charges required by this
29 section. Any such person may enter his the private sewer into any sewer of the district
30 while the same is under construction and before completion of said sewer at the point of
31 entry, and before an entrance charge is established, on obtaining a permit in writing from
32 the ~~trustees~~ superintendent of the district; but after the sewer is completed to the point of
33 entry and an entrance charge established on that location, no such person shall enter his
34 the private sewer into such sewer until he the person has paid the entrance charge and
35 obtained a permit in writing from the ~~trustees~~ superintendent as aforesaid. All such
36 permits shall be recorded by the clerk of the district in its records before the same are
37 issued.

38 **Sec. 8. Contracts with municipalities authorized.** The said district is
39 authorized to contract with persons, corporations, districts ~~and other, utilities,~~
40 municipalities, both the State or other governmental entity whether located inside and or
41 outside the boundaries of the district, including the Town of Boothbay Harbor and the
42 Town of Boothbay, to provide for disposal of sewage and commercial and industrial
43 waste through the district's system and through the system of any such person,
44 corporation, district or other, utility or municipality or the State or other governmental
45 entity; and said Town of Boothbay Harbor is and Town of Boothbay are authorized to

1 contract, individually or together, with said district for the collection, distribution and
2 disposal of sewage, ~~surface water~~ and other waste matter, and for said purposes; said
3 town ~~towns~~ may raise money as for other municipal charges.

4 **Sec. 9. Excavation or repair work, closing of ways.** Whenever said district
5 shall enter, dig up or excavate any public way or other land for the purpose of laying its
6 sewers, drains or pipes, constructing manholes or catch basins or their appurtenances, or
7 maintaining the same, or for any other purpose, the work shall be expeditiously done with
8 the least possible interruption, and on completion of the work, the district shall restore
9 said way or land to the condition it was in prior to such work, or to a condition equally as
10 good.

11 Whenever the character of the work is such as to endanger travel on any public way,
12 the municipal officers of the Town of Boothbay Harbor, the Town of Boothbay or the
13 Department of Transportation, as appropriate, may order a temporary closing of such
14 way, and of any intersecting way, upon request of said district, and the way shall remain
15 closed to public travel until said municipal officers or officials of the department deem it
16 is restored to a condition safe for traffic.

17 **Sec. 10. Surface water facilities; joint facilities; separation of same.** Any
18 other provision of this act to the contrary notwithstanding, the said district shall be under
19 no duty or obligation to construct, maintain, improve, extend or provide drains, pipes,
20 catch basins or any other facilities for storm or surface water drainage, and all drains,
21 pipes, catch basins or other facilities owned by said the Town of Boothbay Harbor or the
22 Town of Boothbay and used exclusively for storm or surface water drainage shall remain
23 the property of said the town, and no such drain, pipe, catch basin or other facility shall
24 be transferred to the district to be thereafter maintained and operated by the district
25 without the joint approval of the ~~selectmen~~ municipal officers of said the Town of
26 Boothbay Harbor or the Town of Boothbay and the trustees of said district. Any sewer or
27 drain owned by said Town of Boothbay Harbor at the time of acceptance of this act and
28 used for both sanitary sewage disposal and storm and surface water drainage shall pass to
29 and be vested in said district, and said district shall be entitled to charge said town for the
30 use of the same for storm or surface water drainage at such rates as the trustees may
31 determine. No additional catch basins or other facilities draining into any such combined
32 sewer or drain shall be constructed without the approval of said trustees. If and when the
33 district shall construct and provide a sewer or drain which permits separation of sanitary
34 sewage previously disposed of through any such combined sewer or drain, the said
35 district, by vote of the trustees, shall transfer and convey back to said Town of Boothbay
36 Harbor the facilities for storm and surface water drainage.

37 **Sec. 10-A. Lease of property.** The lease of property by the district is governed
38 by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1045.

39 **Sec. 11. Free access to premises.** The officers or agents of the district shall have
40 free access to all premises served by its sewers, at all reasonable hours, for inspection of
41 plumbing and sewage fixtures, to ascertain the quality and quantity of sewage discharged
42 and the manner of discharge, and to enforce the provisions of this act and the rules and
43 regulations prescribed by the trustees hereunder.

1 **Sec. 12. Buildings to connect with sewer if available.** ~~Every~~ Except as
2 provided in this section, upon receiving a request from the district to connect a building in
3 the district intended for industrial, business or recreational use or for human habitation or
4 occupancy which or that has facilities for discharge or disposal of waste water or
5 commercial or industrial waste and that is located within 400 200 feet of a public sewer
6 on property abutting on a street or way in which there is a public sewer, or any such
7 building within 400 200 feet of a public sewer, shall have a house drainage system which
8 shall be caused to be connected with the sewer by the owner or person against whom
9 taxes on the premises are assessed in the most direct manner possible the owner of that
10 building shall arrange to have the building connected through a sanitary sewer or
11 drainage system to the district's accessible sewer or drain within 90 days after receiving
12 request therefor from the district, or within such further time as the trustees of the district
13 may grant, and, if feasible, with a separate connection for each house or building;
14 provided, however, that existing buildings which are already served by a satisfactory
15 private sewer system which meets and continues to meet, in the judgment of the trustees,
16 the applicable requirements of the State Plumbing Code and all applicable laws and
17 ordinances shall not be required to connect with the public sewer connections for existing
18 buildings which are already served by a private sewer system are governed by the Maine
19 Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1046, subsection 4. A person who receives a notice in
20 accordance with this section to connect to a building and fails to connect to the building
21 in accordance with this section is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$2,500, payable
22 to the district. This penalty is recoverable in a civil action.

23 **Sec. 13. Sanitary provisions and penalty for violations.** Any A person who
24 shall may not place, discharge or leave any offensive or injurious matter or material on or
25 in the conduits, catch basins or receptacles of said district contrary to its regulations; or
26 shall willfully knowingly injure any conduit, pipe, reservoir, flush tank, catch basin,
27 manhole, outlet, engine, pump or other property held, owned or used by said district for
28 the purposes of this act shall be liable to pay twice the amount of the damages to said
29 district, to be recovered in any proper action; and such person, on conviction of any of
30 said acts or willful injury aforesaid and any person who violates the provisions of sections
31 11 or 12, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$200 or by imprisonment not
32 exceeding one year, or by both. A person who violates this section is liable to pay twice
33 the amount of the damages to the district to be recovered in any proper action and is
34 subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$2,500 for each violation, payable to the district.
35 The civil penalty is recoverable in a civil action. Penalty for violation of standards by an
36 industrial user is governed by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1046,
37 subsection 1.

38 **Sec. 14. Trustees and officer; tenure of office; election to office;**
39 **organization; vacancies; compensation.** All of the affairs of said the district shall
40 be are managed by a board of 3 trustees, who must be residents therein, who shall be
41 chosen as hereinafter provided of the district.

42 As soon as may be after acceptance of this act, the municipal officers of the Town of
43 Boothbay Harbor shall appoint 3 trustees of said district to hold office as follows: one to
44 serve until the first annual meeting of said town following the acceptance of this act; one
45 to serve until the 2nd annual meeting of said town following such acceptance; and one to
46 serve until the 3rd annual meeting of said town following such acceptance. At each

1 ~~annual meeting of said town, beginning with the first annual meeting after acceptance of~~
2 ~~this act, one trustee shall be elected by ballot as hereafter provided to serve until the~~
3 ~~annual meeting of said town occurring 3 years thereafter and until his successor is elected~~
4 ~~and qualified. When any trustee ceases to be a resident of said district, he vacates his~~
5 ~~office as trustee. All trustees, if residents of said district, shall be eligible for reelection~~
6 ~~or reappointment.~~

7 ~~The nomination of all candidates for trustee to be elected as provided by this act shall~~
8 ~~be by nomination papers signed in the aggregate for each candidate by not less than 25~~
9 ~~nor more than 50 qualified voters resident in said district. Each voter signing a~~
10 ~~nomination paper shall make his signature in person, and each voter may subscribe to as~~
11 ~~many nominations as there are trustees to be elected in said district and no more. Such~~
12 ~~nomination papers, before being filed, shall be submitted to the town clerk of the Town of~~
13 ~~Boothbay Harbor, who shall forthwith certify thereon that number of the signatures which~~
14 ~~are names of qualified voters resident in said district. One of the signers to each such~~
15 ~~separate paper shall swear to the truth thereon, and the certificate of such oath shall be~~
16 ~~annexed to or made upon the nomination papers. Such nomination papers shall be filed~~
17 ~~with the town clerk of the Town of Boothbay Harbor not less than 14 days, exclusive of~~
18 ~~Sundays, previous to the day of such election. With such nomination papers shall also be~~
19 ~~filed the consent in writing of the person or persons nominated. All nomination papers,~~
20 ~~being filed and being in apparent conformity with the foregoing provisions, shall be~~
21 ~~deemed to be valid. If not in apparent conformity, they may be seasonably amended~~
22 ~~under oath. In case any candidate who has been duly nominated under the provisions~~
23 ~~hereof shall die before the day of election, or shall withdraw in writing, or shall remove~~
24 ~~his place of residence from said district, the vacancy may be supplied in the manner~~
25 ~~herein provided for such nominations, except that the time limit for filing such~~
26 ~~nomination papers shall not apply. The name so supplied for the vacancy shall, if the~~
27 ~~ballots have not been printed, be placed on the ballots instead of the original nomination;~~
28 ~~or if the ballots have been printed, new ballots containing the new nomination shall, if~~
29 ~~practical, be furnished, or slips containing the new nomination shall be printed under the~~
30 ~~direction of the town clerk which shall be pasted upon said ballots and over the name of~~
31 ~~the candidate whose nomination has been vacated as aforesaid, and thereafter shall~~
32 ~~become part of said ballots as if originally printed thereon. The ballot in said district~~
33 ~~shall contain the names of all candidates so nominated in such district alphabetically~~
34 ~~arranged, printed in one column under the heading "For Trustee of the Boothbay Harbor~~
35 ~~Sewer District." Above such heading shall be printed "Vote for ????" (the number to be~~
36 ~~elected to be inserted therein). Make a cross or a check mark to the right of the name(s)~~
37 ~~voted for." As many blank spaces shall be left after the names of the candidates as there~~
38 ~~are trustees to be elected in which the voter may, by writing, insert the name of any~~
39 ~~person or persons for whom he desires to vote. In preparing his ballot the voter shall~~
40 ~~mark a cross (X) or a check mark (v) against and to the right of such names on the ballot~~
41 ~~as he desires to vote for, not to exceed the number of trustees so to be elected in said~~
42 ~~district. At each annual meeting of said Town of Boothbay Harbor, balloting for trustee~~
43 ~~of said district shall take place concurrently with balloting for the municipal officers of~~
44 ~~said town, but separate ballots shall be provided for the balloting for trustee of the district~~
45 ~~as hereinbefore provided. The result of such election shall be declared by the selectmen~~
46 ~~of said Town of Boothbay Harbor and due certificate thereof filed with the town clerk~~

1 and the clerk of the district. ~~The district shall reimburse the town for the expense of any~~
2 ~~district election.~~

3 ~~As soon as convenient after their appointment, the first board of trustees shall hold a~~
4 ~~meeting at some convenient place in the district, to be called by any member thereof in~~
5 ~~writing, designating the time and place and delivered in hand to the other 2 members not~~
6 ~~less than 2 full days before the meeting; provided, however, that they may meet by~~
7 ~~agreement without such notice. At this original meeting the trustees shall organize by~~
8 ~~electing from their own members a chairman, a treasurer and a clerk and adopting a~~
9 ~~corporate seal. The trustees may adopt and establish by laws, consistent with the laws of~~
10 ~~the State of Maine and necessary for their own convenience and the proper management~~
11 ~~of the affairs of the district, and perform any other acts within the powers delegated to~~
12 ~~them by law.~~

13 ~~Within one week after each annual election, the trustees shall meet for the purpose of~~
14 ~~electing a chairman, treasurer and clerk to serve for the ensuing year and until their~~
15 ~~successors are elected and qualified. The trustees from time to time may choose and~~
16 ~~employ, and fix the compensation of, any other necessary officers and agents who shall~~
17 ~~serve at their pleasure. The treasurer shall furnish bond in such sum and with such~~
18 ~~sureties as the trustees shall approve, the cost thereof to be paid by the district.~~

19 ~~Members of the board of trustees shall be eligible to any office under the board. The~~
20 ~~trustees, as such, shall serve without compensation; but the treasurer may be allowed such~~
21 ~~compensation as the trustees shall determine.~~

22 ~~The trustees shall be sworn to the faithful performance of their duties as such, which~~
23 ~~shall include the duties of any member who shall serve as clerk or clerk pro tem. They~~
24 ~~shall make and publish an annual report, including a report of the treasurer, and such~~
25 ~~report may be included in, and published as part of, the town report.~~

26 ~~Vacancies in the office of trustee from whatever cause shall be filled by appointment~~
27 ~~by the remaining trustees until the next annual election. If at any annual election there~~
28 ~~shall exist a vacancy in an unexpired term, a trustee shall be elected to fill such vacancy~~
29 ~~for such unexpired term, and the voters of the district shall cast their ballots as~~
30 ~~hereinbefore prescribed, voting for as many candidates as there are offices to be filled.~~

31 1. Nominations and elections of trustees must be conducted in accordance with the
32 laws relating to municipal elections in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, chapter
33 121, and all elections must be conducted by secret ballot in accordance with Title 30-A,
34 section 2528.

35 When the term of office of a trustee expires, the trustee's successor is elected at large by a
36 plurality vote of the voters of the district. For the purpose of election, a special election
37 must be called and held on the date established by the trustees. The election must be
38 called by the trustees of the district in the same manner as town meetings are called and,
39 for this purpose, the trustees are vested with the powers of municipal officers.

40 The trustees shall acquire a complete list of all the registered voters residing in the
41 district. The trustees may acquire this list from the registrar of any town within the
42 district. The towns may charge a fee for providing the list. The list acquired by the
43 trustees governs the eligibility of a voter, since a voter eligible to vote for trustees and on
44 district matters generally must be a voter in the town from which the trustee is elected.

1 Voters who reside outside the territorial limits of the district, as defined in this act, are not
2 eligible voters. All warrants issued for elections by the trustees must show that only the
3 voters residing within the territorial limits of the district are entitled to vote.

4 2. When any trustee ceases to be a resident of the district, that trustee vacates the
5 office as trustee. A trustee, if a resident of the district, is eligible for reelection or
6 reappointment. A person who is a municipal officer, as defined in the Maine Revised
7 Statutes, Title 30-A, section 2001, subsection 10, of either of the towns located within the
8 district is not eligible for appointment, nomination or election as a trustee of the district.

9 3. The trustees may adopt and establish bylaws, consistent with the laws of the State
10 of Maine and necessary for their own convenience and the proper management of the
11 affairs of the district, and perform any other acts within the powers delegated to them by
12 law.

13 4. Within 2 weeks after each annual election, the trustees shall meet for the purpose
14 of electing a chair, treasurer and clerk to serve for the ensuing year and until their
15 successors are elected and qualified. The trustees from time to time may choose and
16 employ, and fix the compensation of, any other necessary officers and agents who shall
17 serve at their pleasure. The treasurer shall furnish bond in such sum and with such
18 sureties as the trustees shall approve, the cost thereof to be paid by the district.

19 5. The trustees of the district receive compensation in accordance with the Maine
20 Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1036, subsection 7.

21 6. The trustees must be sworn to the faithful performance of their duties as such,
22 which must include the duties of any member who serves as clerk or clerk pro tem. They
23 shall make and publish an annual report, including a report of the treasurer, and such
24 report may be included in, and published as part of, the town report.

25 7. Business of the district must be conducted in accordance with the applicable
26 provisions of the Freedom of Access Act.

27 8. Vacancies in the office of trustee from whatever cause must be filled by
28 appointment by the remaining trustees until the next annual election. If at any annual
29 election there exists a vacancy in an unexpired term, a trustee must be elected to fill such
30 vacancy for such unexpired term, and the voters of the district shall cast their ballots as
31 hereinbefore prescribed, voting for as many candidates as there are offices to be filled.

32 ~~**Sec. 15. Special meetings; qualifications of voters of district.** Special~~
33 ~~meetings of the district may be called by the board of trustees at any time, and notice of~~
34 ~~special meetings, stating the place and time thereof and the business to be transacted~~
35 ~~thereat, shall be signed by the chairman or clerk of the board of trustees and shall be~~
36 ~~conspicuously posted in at least 2 public places within the district, not less than 7 days~~
37 ~~inclusive of Sundays, before the meeting. Any such meeting may be adjourned from time~~
38 ~~to time by vote of the qualified voters present thereat, though less than a quorum, and~~
39 ~~without notice of the time and place of the adjourned session, other than announcement at~~
40 ~~the meeting. Twenty five persons qualified to vote in such meetings shall constitute a~~
41 ~~quorum. All meetings of the district shall be presided over by a moderator chosen in the~~
42 ~~same manner and with the same authority as moderators of town meetings. All persons~~
43 ~~resident in said district and qualified to vote for Governor under the laws of this State~~

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~~shall be entitled to vote in any meeting of the district, including the meeting for acceptance of this charter.~~

Sec. 16. Property tax exempt. The property, both real and personal, rights and franchises of said district shall be forever exempt from taxation.

Sec. 17. Authorized to receive government aid, borrow money, issue bonds and notes. For accomplishing the purposes of this act, said district, by vote of its board of trustees, without district vote ~~except as hereinafter provided~~, is hereby authorized to borrow money temporarily and to issue therefor its negotiable notes, and for the purpose of renewing and refunding the indebtedness so created, of paying any necessary expenses and liabilities incurred under the provisions of this act, including organizational and other necessary expenses and liabilities whether incurred by the district or the Town of Boothbay Harbor, the district being authorized to reimburse said Town of Boothbay Harbor for any such expense incurred or paid by it, and in acquiring properties, paying damages, laying sewers, drains and conduits, constructing, maintaining and operating a sewage plant or system and making renewals, additions, extensions and improvements to the same and to cover interest payments during the period of construction, said Boothbay Harbor Sewer District, by votes of its board of trustees, without district vote ~~except as hereinafter provided~~, is also hereby authorized to issue, from time to time, bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness of the district in such amount or amounts, bearing interest at such rate or rates, and having such terms and provisions as the trustees shall determine receive government aid, borrow money, hold funds and issue, secure and refund bonds and notes as set forth in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1052 and subject to all requirements therein. All bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued under this act and the transfer of and the income from those bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness, including any profit made on the sale, are exempt from taxation in the State. Bonds and notes issued by the district under this section are securities in which all public officers and public bodies of the State and its political subdivisions, all insurance companies and associations and other persons carrying on an insurance business, trust companies, banks, bankers, banking associations, savings banks and savings associations, including savings and loan associations, credit unions, building and loan associations, investment companies, executors, administrators, trustees and other fiduciaries, pension, profit-sharing and retirement funds, and other persons carrying on a banking business, and all other persons authorized to invest in bonds or other obligations of the State may properly and legally invest funds, including capital in their control or belonging to them. The bonds and notes are securities that may properly and legally be deposited with and received by any state, municipal or public officer, or any agency or political subdivision of the State, for any purpose for which the deposit of bonds or other obligations of the State is authorized by law. The total indebtedness of the district at any one time outstanding may not exceed the sum of \$8,500,000. ~~In the case of a vote by the trustees to authorize bonds or notes to pay for the acquisition of property, for the cost of a sewage plant or system or part thereof, for renewals or additions or for other improvements in the nature of capital costs, the estimated cost of which singly or in the aggregate is \$50,000 or more, but not for renewing or refunding existing indebtedness or to pay for maintenance, repairs or for current expenses, notice of the proposed debt, the general purpose or purposes for which it was authorized and of the date of a special district meeting for the purpose of voters of~~

~~the district voting thereon shall be given by the clerk by publication at least once in a newspaper having a general circulation in the Town of Boothbay Harbor. After 7 full days following the date on which such notice was first published the trustees shall hold a special district meeting for the purpose of permitting the voters of the district to express approval or disapproval of the amount of debt so authorized. If at such district meeting a majority of voters present and voting thereon expresses disapproval of the amount of debt authorized by the trustees, the said debt shall not be incurred and the vote of the trustees authorizing the same shall be void and of no effect. If at such district meeting a majority of voters present and voting thereon expresses disapproval of the amount of debt authorized by the trustees, the said debt shall not be incurred and the vote of the trustees authorizing the same shall be void and of no effect. Said bonds, notes and evidences of indebtedness may be issued to mature serially in annual installments of not less than 1% of the face amount of the issue and beginning not later than 2 years from the date thereof, or made to run for such periods as the trustees may determine, but no issue thereof shall run for a longer period than 40 years from the date of original issue thereof. Bonds, notes or evidences of indebtedness may be issued with or without provision for calling the same prior to maturity, and if callable may be made callable at par or at such premium as the trustees may determine. All bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness shall have inscribed upon their face the words "Boothbay Harbor Sewer District," shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the chairman of the board of trustees of the district, and if coupon bonds are issued, the interest coupons attached thereto shall bear the facsimile of the signature of the treasurer. All such bonds, notes and evidences of indebtedness so issued by the district shall be legal obligations of the district, which is hereby declared to be a quasi municipal corporation within the meaning of the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 90-A, section 23, as amended, and all provisions of said section shall be applicable thereto. The said district may, from time to time, issue in one series or in separate series, its bonds, notes and other evidences of indebtedness, for the purpose of paying, redeeming or refunding outstanding bonds, notes or evidences of indebtedness, and each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan. All bonds, notes and evidences of indebtedness issued by said district shall be legal investments for savings banks in the State of Maine and shall be tax exempt. The said district is authorized and empowered to enter into agreements with the State or Federal Government, or any agency of either, or any corporation, commission or board authorized by the State or Federal Government to grant or loan money to or otherwise assist in the financing of projects such as the district is authorized to carry out, and to accept grants and borrow money from any such government agency, corporation, commission or board as may be necessary or desirable to enforce the provisions of this act. The district may increase this debt limit by referendum as provided by Title 38, section 1054.~~

Sec. 18. Sinking fund provided for; investments. In case any of said bonds or notes are made to run for a period of years, a sinking fund shall be established by the trustees of said district for the purpose of redeeming said bonds or notes when they become due and a sum equal to not less than 1% of the aggregate principal of the outstanding bonds or notes issued on account of or in behalf of said district, as aforesaid, shall be turned into said sinking fund each year to provide for the final extinguishment of said district funded debt.

1 The money set aside for the sinking fund shall be devoted to the retirement of said
2 notes and bonds, and shall be used for no other purposes, and shall be invested in such
3 securities as savings banks are allowed to hold.

4 Whenever any bonds of said district become due, or can be purchased by said trustees
5 on favorable terms, said trustees shall, if sufficient funds have accumulated in said
6 sinking fund, redeem or purchase said bonds, and cancel them. In no case shall bonds so
7 cancelled or redeemed be reissued.

8 In case the amount in said sinking fund shall not be sufficient to pay the total amount
9 of the bonds falling due at any one time, authority to issue new bonds sufficient to
10 redeem so many of said bonds as cannot be redeemed from the sinking fund is hereby
11 granted to said trustees.

12 The district may invest its funds, including the sinking fund, reserve funds and trust
13 funds, in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1055.

14 **Sec. 19. Rates and tolls; application of revenues.** All persons, firms and
15 corporations, whether public, private or municipal, shall pay to the treasurer of said
16 district the rates, tolls, rents, entrance charges and other lawful charges established or
17 revised by the trustees for the sewer or drainage service used or available with respect to
18 their real estate, which rates shall be fair and reasonable charges for connection with and
19 for the use of the sewer or drainage service and may include a charge for the district's
20 readiness to serve to be charged against owners of real estate abutting on or accessible to
21 sewers or drains of the district but not actually connected thereto, whether or not such real
22 estate is improved. In establishing or revising such rates, tolls, rents or charges, the
23 trustees may classify the property connected or to be connected with the sewerage or
24 drainage system and may give consideration to any factors relating to kind, quality or
25 extent of use of any such property or qualification of property including: (a) the volume
26 of water discharged into the sewerage or drainage system; (b) the type and size of
27 buildings connected with such system; (c) the number of plumbing fixtures connected
28 with such system; (d) the number of persons customarily using the property served by
29 such system; (e) in the case of commercial or industrial property, the average number of
30 employees, customers and guests using the property; and (f) the quality and character of
31 the material discharged into the sewerage or drainage system. The trustees may establish
32 minimum charges in connection with and for the use of a sewerage or drainage system.

33 Rates, tolls, rents and entrance charges shall be uniform within the district whenever
34 the cost to the district of installation and maintenance of sewers and drains and their
35 respective appurtenances and the cost of service is are substantially uniform; ~~but nothing~~
36 ~~in this act shall preclude~~ except that the district ~~from establishing~~ may establish a higher
37 rate, toll, rent or entrance charge than the regular rates, tolls, rents and entrance charges in
38 sections where, for any reason, the cost to the district of construction and maintenance, or
39 the cost of service, exceeds the average, ~~but such as long as~~ the higher rates, tolls, rents
40 and entrance charges shall be are uniform throughout the sections where they apply, and
41 trustees may reduce the impact or connection fee for sewer service to newly constructed
42 affordable housing in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1048,
43 subsection 1, paragraph B.

44 Adoption of a new rate schedule is governed by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38,
45 section 1048, subsection 5.

1 The sewer rates, tolls, rents and entrance charges shall be so established as to provide
2 revenue for the following purposes:

3 I. To pay the current expenses for operating and maintaining the sewerage, drainage
4 and treatment system;

5 II. ~~To provide for the payment of interest on the indebtedness created~~ pay the
6 principal of and premium, if any, and interest on all bonds and notes issued by the
7 district;

8 III. ~~To provide each year a sum equal to not less than 1% nor more than 5% of the~~

28 **Sec. 20. Sewer extensions; assessment against lot benefited.** Sewer
29 extensions are governed by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1042. When the
30 district has constructed and completed a common sewer, the trustees may, if they so
31 determine, in order to defray a portion of the expense thereof, determine what lots or
32 parcels of land, whether or not buildings or other structures are located thereon or
33 whether or not they are otherwise improved, are benefited by such main or sewer, and
34 estimate and assess upon such lots and parcels of land, and against the owner thereof, or
35 person in possession or against whom taxes thereon are assessed, whether said person to
36 whom the assessment is so made shall be the owner, tenant, lessee or agent, and whether
37 the same is occupied or not, such sum not exceeding such benefit as they may deem just
38 and equitable towards defraying the expenses of constructing and completing such sewer,
39 together with such sewage disposal units and appurtenances as may be necessary, the
40 whole of such assessments not to exceed 1/2 of the cost of such sewer and sewage
41 disposal units. The trustees shall file with the clerk of the district the location of such
42 sewer and sewage disposal unit, with a profile description of the same, and a statement of
43 the amount assessed upon each lot or parcel of land so assessed, a description of each lot
44 or parcel, and the name of the owner of such lots or parcels of land of person against

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whom said assessment shall be made, and the clerk of such district shall record the same in a book kept for that purpose, and within 10 days after such filing, each person so assessed shall be notified of such assessment by having an authentic copy of said assessment, with an order or notice signed by the ~~clerk of said district~~ chair of the board of trustees, stating the time and place for a hearing upon the subject matter of said assessments, given to each person so assessed or left at his the person's usual place of abode in said district. If ~~he~~ such person has no place of abode in said district, then such notice shall be given or left at the abode of his the person's tenant or lessee if ~~he~~ the person has one in said district. If ~~he~~ such person has no such tenant or lessee in said district, then notice must be given by posting said notice in some conspicuous place in the vicinity of the lot or parcel of land so assessed; at least 30 days before said hearing; or such notice may be given by publishing the same once a week, for 3 successive weeks in any newspaper of general circulation in said district, the first publication to be at least 30 days before said hearing. A return made upon a copy of such notice by any constable in said Town of Boothbay Harbor or the Town of Boothbay or the production of the paper containing such notice shall be conclusive evidence that said notice has been given, and upon such hearing the trustees shall have power to revise, increase or diminish any of such assessments, and all such revisions, increases or diminutions shall be in writing and recorded by the clerk of the district.

Sec. 21. Right of appeal. Any person ~~aggrieved by~~ dissatisfied with the decision of said trustees as it relates to any assessment for sewer construction shall have the same rights of appeal as are provided ~~in the case of laying out of town ways~~ by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 3443, as amended.

Sec. 22. Assessments; lien; enforcement. All assessments made under the provisions of section 20 shall create a lien upon each and every lot or parcel of land so assessed and the buildings upon the same, which lien shall take effect when the trustees file with the clerk of the district the completed assessment, and shall continue for one year thereafter; ~~and within.~~ Within 10 days after the date of hearing on said assessment, the clerk of the district shall make out a list of all such assessments, the amount of each, and the name of the person against whom the same is assessed, and ~~he~~ shall certify the list and deliver it to the treasurer of said district. If said assessments are not paid within 3 months from the date thereof, the treasurer may bring ~~an~~ a civil action ~~of debt~~ for the collection of said assessment in the name of the district against the person against whom said assessment is made and for the enforcement of said lien. ~~Such action shall be begun by writ of attachment commanding the officer serving it to specially attach the real estate upon which the lien is claimed, which shall be served as other writs of attachment to enforce liens on real estate.~~ The ~~declaration~~ complaint in such action shall contain a statement of such assessment, a description of the real estate against which the assessment is made, and an allegation that a lien is claimed on said real estate to secure the payment of the assessment. If no service is made upon the defendant or it shall appear that any other persons are interested in such real estate, the court shall order such further notice of such action as appears proper, and shall allow such other persons to become parties thereto. If it shall appear upon trial of such action that such assessment was legally made against said real estate, and is unpaid, and that there is an existing lien on said real estate for the payment of such assessment, judgment shall be rendered for such assessment, interest and costs of suit against the defendants and against the real

2 certificate signed by the treasurer setting forth the amount of the rate, toll, rent or other
3 charge, and a description of the real estate on which the lien is claimed, stating that a lien
4 is claimed to secure payment of the charge and that notice and demand for payment of the
5 charge has been given or made in accordance with the provisions of this section, and that
6 the charge remains unpaid. At the time of the recording of a certificate in the Registry of
7 Deeds, the treasurer shall file in the office of the district a true copy of the certificate and

11 The filing of the certificate in the Registry of Deeds is deemed to create, and creates,
12 a mortgage on the real estate described in the deed for the district that has priority over all
13 other mortgages, liens, attachments and encumbrances of any nature, except liens,
14 attachments and claims for taxes, and gives to the district all the rights usually possessed
15 by mortgagees, except that the district as mortgagee does not have a right to possession of
16 the real estate until the right of redemption provided for has expired. If the mortgage,
17 together with interest and costs, is not paid within 18 months after the date of filing of the
18 certificate in the Registry of Deeds, the mortgage is deemed foreclosed and the right of
19 redemption expired. The filing of the certificate in the Registry of Deeds is sufficient
20 notice of the existence of the mortgage. In the event that the rate, toll, rent or other
21 charge, with interest and costs, is paid within the period of redemption, the treasurer of
22 the district shall discharge the mortgage in the same manner as provided for discharge of
23 real estate mortgages.

24 The cost to be paid by the owner of the real estate served is the sum of the fees for
25 receiving, recording and indexing the lien, or its discharge, as established by the Maine
26 Revised Statutes, Title 33, section 751, plus \$13 and all certified mail, return receipt
27 requested fees.

28 The district shall pay the treasurer \$1 for filing the lien certificate and the amount
29 paid for certified mail, return receipt requested fees. The fees for recording the lien
30 certificate must be paid by the district to the Register of Deeds.

31 A discharge of the certificate given after the right of redemption has expired and that
32 has been recorded in the Registry of Deeds for more than one year terminates all title of
33 the sewer district derived from that certificate or any other recorded certificate for which
34 the right of redemption expired 10 years or more prior to the foreclosure date of this
35 discharge lien, unless the sewer district has conveyed any interest based upon the title
36 acquired from any of the affected liens.

37 The treasurer of the district has full and complete authority and power to collect rates
38 and fees established under section 19 or otherwise authorized by law. The treasurer may,
39 after demand for payment, sue in the name of the district in a civil action in any court of
40 competent jurisdiction for any rates remaining unpaid. In addition to other methods
41 established by law for the collection of rates and without waiver of the right to sue for the
42 collection of rates, the lien created under this section may be enforced in the following
43 manner.

44 1. The treasurer may, after the expiration of 3 months and within one year after the
45 date when the rates became due and payable, give to the owner of the real estate served,

1 leave at the owner's last and usual place of abode or send by certified mail, return receipt
2 requested, to the owner's last known address a notice in writing signed by the treasurer or
3 bearing the treasurer's facsimile signature, stating the amount of the rates due, describing
4 the real estate upon which the lien is claimed, stating that a lien is claimed on the real
5 estate to secure the payment of the rates and demanding the payment of the rates within
6 30 days after service or mailing, with \$1 added to the demanded rate for the treasurer and
7 an additional fee to cover mailing the notice by certified mail, return receipt requested.
8 The notice must contain a statement that the district is willing to arrange installment
9 payments of the outstanding debt.

10 2. After the expiration of 30 days and within one year after giving notice pursuant to
11 subsection 1, the treasurer of the district shall record in the Lincoln County Registry of
12 Deeds a certificate signed by the treasurer setting forth the amount of the rates due,
13 describing the real estate on which the lien is claimed and stating that a lien is claimed on
14 the real estate to secure payment of the rates and that a notice and demand for payment
15 has been given or made in accordance with this section and stating further that the rates
16 remain unpaid. At the time of the recording of the certificate in the registry of deeds, the
17 treasurer shall file in the office of the district a true copy of the certificate and shall mail a
18 true copy of the certificate by certified mail, return receipt requested, to each record
19 holder of any mortgage on the real estate, addressed to the record holder at the record
20 holder's last and usual place of abode.

21 3. The filing of the certificate in the Lincoln County Registry of Deeds creates a
22 mortgage held by the district on the real estate described in the certificate that has priority
23 over all other mortgages, liens, attachments and encumbrances of any nature, except
24 liens, attachments and claims for taxes, and gives to the district all the rights usually
25 possessed by mortgagees, except that the district as mortgagee does not have any right to
26 possession of that real estate until the right of redemption has expired.

27 4. If the mortgage created under subsection 3, together with interest and costs, has
28 not been paid within 18 months after the date of filing the certificate in the Lincoln
29 County Registry of Deeds in accordance with subsection 2, the mortgage is foreclosed
30 and the right of redemption expires. The filing of the certificate in the registry of deeds is
31 sufficient notice of the existence of the mortgage. In the event that the rate, with interest
32 and costs, is paid within the period of redemption, the treasurer of the district shall
33 discharge the mortgage in the same manner as provided for discharge of real estate
34 mortgages.

35 5. The owner of the real estate shall pay the sum of the fees for receiving, recording
36 and indexing the lien, or its discharge, as established by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title
37 33, section 751, plus \$13, plus all certified mail, return receipt requested, fees.

38 6. Not more than 45 days or less than 30 days before the foreclosing date of the
39 mortgage created under subsection 3, the treasurer of the district shall notify the party
40 named on the mortgage and each record holder of a mortgage on the real estate in a
41 writing signed by the treasurer or bearing the treasurer's facsimile signature and left at the
42 holder's last and usual place of abode or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to
43 the holder's last known address of the impending automatic foreclosure and indicating the
44 exact date of foreclosure. For sending this notice, the district is entitled to receive \$3 plus
45 all certified mail, return receipt requested, fees, which must be added to and become a

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part of the amount due under subsection 5. If notice is not given in the time period specified in this subsection, the person not receiving timely notice has up to 30 days after the treasurer provides notice as specified in this subsection in which to redeem the mortgage. The notice of impending automatic foreclosure must be substantially in the following form:

District Treasurer

7. The district shall pay the treasurer \$1 for the notice, \$1 for filing the lien certificate and the amount paid for certified mail, return receipt requested, fees. The fees for recording the lien certificate must be paid by the sewer district to the Lincoln County Registry of Deeds.

8. A discharge of the certificate given after the right of redemption has expired, which discharge has been recorded in the Lincoln County Registry of Deeds for more than one year, terminates all title of the sewer district derived from that certificate or any other recorded certificate for which the right of redemption expired 10 years or more prior to the foreclosure date of this discharge lien, unless the district has conveyed any interest based upon the title acquired from any of the affected liens.

9. The district has had and continues to have the authority to collect rates and fees in this manner without having to become a qualified sewer district under Title 38, section 1050, and all liens issued and recorded under the district's authority prior to and subsequent to the effective date of this subsection remain valid.

10. The district may waive a lien foreclosure in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1049.

1 **Sec. 25-A. Landlord access to tenant bill payment information.** Landlord
2 access to information regarding the current status of a tenant's account is governed by the
3 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 1051.

4 **Sec. 26. Construction of this act; bylaws and regulations authorized;**
5 **incidental powers and rights.** This act shall be construed as authorizing a charge by
6 said district for the use of sewers, sewer systems and treatment works in addition to any
7 other assessments now lawfully imposed by general law. The trustees may adopt such
8 rules and regulations and bylaws as may be necessary or convenient to carry out the
9 provisions of this act. All incidental powers, rights and privileges necessary to the
10 accomplishment of the main objects of this act as set forth herein are granted to said
11 district; including the right of the trustees to determine when and where sewerage
12 facilities are most needed, and when and how sewers shall be built.

13 **Sec. 27. Existing statutes not affected; rights conferred subject to**
14 **provisions of law.** Nothing herein contained is intended to repeal or shall be construed
15 as repealing the whole or any part of any existing statute, and all the rights and duties
16 herein mentioned shall be exercised and performed in accordance with any applicable
17 provisions of the ~~Revised Statutes of 1954, chapters 44 and 79 and any acts amendatory~~
18 ~~thereof or additional thereto~~ laws of the State of Maine.

19 **Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date.** This Act takes effect when approved only
20 for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Boothbay Harbor
21 Sewer District at an election called for that purpose and held by November 5, 2020. The
22 election must be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to
23 municipal elections, except that the registrar of voters is not required to prepare or the
24 clerk to post a new list of voters. For the purpose of registration of voters, the registrar of
25 voters must be in session the regular workday preceding the election. The subject matter
26 of this Act is reduced to the following question:

27 "Do you favor adopting the 2019 revision of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer
28 District charter?"

29 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the word "Yes" or
30 "No" their opinion of the same.

31 The results must be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Boothbay
32 Harbor and the Town of Boothbay and due certificate of the results filed by the clerk with
33 the Secretary of State.

34 This Act takes effect for all other purposes immediately upon its approval by a
35 majority of the legal voters voting at the election. Failure to achieve the necessary
36 approval in any referendum does not prohibit subsequent referenda consistent with this
37 section as long as the referenda are held within 2 years after the effective date of this Act.'

38 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
39 section number to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

This amendment removes the provision of the bill that required one trustee on the board of trustees of the Boothbay Harbor Sewer District to be elected from the Town of Boothbay and 2 from the Town of Boothbay Harbor. The amendment also makes a number of technical changes and adds cross-references to bring the charter into conformance with the Standard Sewer District Enabling Act.
